

### Fun, serious, or both?

ne facet of the model railway hobby that has been thrust to the fore in recent months. thanks in part to the recent TV show, The Great Model Railway Challenge, is that this hobby is all about having fun.

Indeed, at the press launch of Hornby Railways' 2019 releases, an exuberant Simon Kohler, now back in his natural role as the firm's head of marketing, emphasised that this is not a toy industry, it's an industry that focuses on people's creativity. "We are all in the business of creating fun and enjoyment." he said.

He's right of course, building a layout, assembling kits and creating model landscapes are about relaxation, creativity and fulfilment - all activities that we could define as elements that make for having a fun time.

On the other hand, there is the equally valid standpoint that the hobby is a studious endeavour and must be taken very seriously indeed. There should be no room for deviation or flamboyance, and most certainly, inaccuracies and mistakes in one's research, modelling, or interpretation must not be tolerated. Anything less is seen as dumbing-down or pandering to the masses in order to get noticed, and worse still, by

inadvertently publishing errors and mistakes, myths and fallacies are perpetuated like traps for unwary future generations to fall into.

I've often found myself on both sides of this topic in the past, and both sides each have very valid and persuasive arguments. My good friend, fellow photographer, and very experienced and well known locomotive builder, Tony Wright puts a compelling case forward for ensuring accuracy is

paramount at all times in this month's Talking Points column on page 122. And it's not just factual accuracy he's concerned about, he is also worried that inappropriate techniques are often taught and demonstrated under the guise of being the easy option: such attitudes he believes will lead to the loss of traditional skills to the detriment of us all.

Interestingly, the topic of declining standards of accuracy is not a new one. As part of our 70th anniversary celebrations we found an old scale

> drawings article featuring the station building at Wrington Vale in Somerset. This drawing turned out to be woefully inaccurate, so much so, that another reader wrote in 'disgusted' by the error.

> He did at least proffer his own ostensibly 'correct' drawing which we later published in our letters pages. However, as luck would have it, an identical (but for a later extension) structure still survives as a private residence at the terminus of the old line in Blagdon. We undertook our own survey of the building with the owner's permission and have used the dimensions to present an updated drawing on page 107. It will certainly make an ideal station building for a small

layout and I sincerely hope the drawing is as accurate as we can possibly get it.

So accuracy is important, but we shouldn't let it prevent us from having fun either. Railway modelling is a leisure activity and should not be restricted by regulation or dogma: both persuasions can happily live side by side. I for one love to get things as right as I can, but I also like to enjoy all the fun elements that go with the hobby.

# Catesby and Dent

#### Two stations on two levels, in OO gauge

Constructed into a large room with a fiddle yard in another, this double-level system celebrates the London Extension of the Great Central, and the Settle & Carlisle, by replicating a typical island platform design for the GC on the lower level, and a resemblance of a much-modelled station on the S&C. **DAVID BATES** relates how the layout came to be, and gives us a guided tour around both main lines.

have modelled railways ever since I was young and at the age of 10 until 15 I managed to build a large layout in a 16' x 8' shed, complete with track running outside. Unfortunately when my father passed away we had to move and the layout was dismantled. I started a large layout in the loft in 1980, but in 1983 I managed to buy a house with two upstairs rooms which were perfect in which to put my railway. A start was made, but in 1985 I stopped modelling due to life getting in my way and the layout was scrapped.


Much later on my interest in model railways had again taken hold and a large layout, 24' x 14', with a fiddle yard, 14' x 8', in a separate room, was drawn up and work started. The baseboards were 12mm birch ply and this was placed on 2" x 3" frames with 4" x 2" legs. Unfortunately, this initial build didn't live up to expectations. No provision was made to access the point motors or wiring for the top level as the baseboards were solid beneath on the lower level. This resulted in a lot of drilling and cutting away of the boards and the removal of scenery just to gain access for maintenance purposes.

A father and son team was contacted to try and help me improve the situation. With their help, the upper station of Dent was totally rebuilt to resemble the real station. Trackwork was relaid, the scenics were improved and the wiring was sorted out.


This refinement work took a very long time, but after nearly two years the layout has achieved the reliability I wanted in the first place.


The lower level was based on Great Central principles due to a fondness for this railway and the stock modelled. The upper


Catesby station reflects the London Extension arrangement of a single island platform accessed by a road bridge via steps.



run analogue engines. The buildings are mostly resin from Bachmann and Hornby except for the engine shed which is scratchbuilt. Trackwork is Peco code 75 with code 100 used in the fiddleyard. Points on the main layout are powered by German made Hoffmann servos but the fiddle yard points are powered by Peco PL-11 side mounted motors due to access restrictions.

Recently I have acquired a couple of new control panels which were specially made for me and have laser screen-printed diagrams on them. They are superb. The other panels are aluminium but I may change them for the new type.

The rolling stock is from all manufacturers

but mainly Bachmann and Hornby. The working signals are by Dapol. The layout is populated by figures from a wide range of manufacturers as well as the scenics. The main scenics are supported by cardboard underneath and the grass mat used has been enhanced by the use of flock powders and foam/horsehair foliage.

Self adhesive mats are used under all the trackwork as an aid to sound suppression as well as a six parts water to one part Copydex solution used to fix down the ballast. This mixture stops the drumming effect and gives a more realistic sound of the trains as they run. This combination was used after trials of several other types of methods were used on

test pieces. I am well pleased with the results. The ballast is a mix of various Woodland Scenics colours.

#### A journey around the layout

Boarding our train in the 'rest of the world', (also known as fiddle yard), for a clockwise journey around the layout, we exit a tunnel onto a high embankment. Looking over to our right we can just glimpse the village of Catesby, on the same level as our train, and

centre of the railway room. BR Class 6 Pacific No.72008 Clan Macleod is being turned.

an almost exact representation of the real location but with a couple of extended sidings and a large goods shed. The snow fences can be seen up the hillside to the left. After crossing a stream and road bridge the line swings to the right. A small farm is seen on the left before the railway curves to the left and into the upper fiddle yard.

Departing our train and boarding an express on the lower level for an anti-clockwise run, we are soon off. The line curves to the right in a cutting with Catesby village high up on the left. The farm is again seen on the right as the line sweeps to the left and across a level crossing and a bridge over a stream. It is soon realised, by studying the stream, that it has real water running in it. The line straightens out and there is a magnificent reinforced embankment wall on the right.


We soon pass under a road bridge and immediately see a junction to our left. This line runs up to Sodham Hall Colliery with its


below us to our right is the main station of Catesby with its island platform, avoiding lines and its goods sidings. Catesby is based on the type of station built by the Great Central Railway.

The large motive power depot is situated in the

Our train passes the lower station and over a level crossing and begins to take the curve to our right. High up on the hill to our left is an abandoned windmill and a town in the distance further to the right. Below us are some light engineering buildings where a welder is busy at work, if the blue flashes glimpsed through the windows are anything to go by.

Passing over a trestle bridge across an abandoned railway cutting, and almost immediately, we approach the high five arch railway viaduct over a canal far below. Our train sweeps around the curve and under a road bridge into the station of Dent. This is






▲ Sodham Hall Colliery is dominated by the pithead frame and winding wheels. The site is served by a narrow gauge system.

own narrow gauge internal system and exchange sidings for the main line. The mine can be seen in the distance with its winding tower and large assortment of buildings.

Continuing on, our train eases to the left over a plate girder bridge and then almost immediately over a trestle bridge (over the abandoned railway cutting). Our train soon approaches an overhead road bridge, but we fleetingly glimpse a junction with a line running down from the station, to a large engine shed complex. Our guide tell us that this eight-road shed is based on the Great Central installation at Annesley. The complex has coaling and ash towers which dominate one side of the site as well as a large turntable, elevated water tank, and lifting gantry for light work on engines. A large town street with shop fronts flank the complex on a higher level.

We pass under the road bridge and into Catesby station. Our express does not stop but continues straight through and into the tunnel leading to the 'rest of the world'.

# Hybrid Highs variants

uring early BR days tens of thousands of 12T and 13T 'high goods' wagons carried general merchandise across the rail network. Most had planked or steel bodywork, but around 13,000 combined planked sides with corrugated steel ends. For the purposes of this article I am referring to these vehicles as 'hybrid highs'.

Many modellers will know these as vacuum-fitted opens seen between the mid 1950s and early 1980s wearing BR bauxite livery. At the time of writing, no 4mm R-T-R examples exist, but very decent models can be built using the Parkside PC02A kit.


In passing, the Parkside instruction sheet notes that some unfitted 'hybrid highs' were also built. David Larkin's publications give full details: 4,700 'hybrids' were built between 1946 and 1952 equipped with Morton twoshoe handbrakes, but by the end of the 1950s all but nine had been rebuilt with vacuum brakes.

I felt that these LMS- and BR-built unfitted vehicles could be modelled if a few changes were made to the PC02A kit, and if the characteristic 'part-painted' livery was to be reproduced, much of the work would need to be carried out before the kit was assembled.

#### Altering the Parkside ends

David Larkin's publications state that only two unfitted vehicles were ever equipped with tarpaulin support bars (M421341 and M424537). So to build a more common version without the tarpaulin bar the swing arms, guide arcs, and bases (parts 14, 15, and 16 in the kit) will be superfluous. The backing plates for the guide arcs aren't needed either, and have to be filed off the inner ends (see photo 1). The small moulded holes should now be plugged with a tiny amount of plastic rod/or filler, and the areas that have been altered tidied up. If you're a stickler for detail





you should cut off the lamp brackets (see photo 2) because unfitted vehicles didn't have them. The LMS wagons also had a capping lip on each end; BR examples did not. To reproduce it, remove the top line of rivets and in their place cement a length of 10thou x 20thou microstrip with the longer edge flush with the top. A little plastic filler may be needed to conceal the join. It's worth noting that the LMS vehicles were not usually equipped with chalking/label boards on their ends, so those supplied in the Parkside kit (part 3) should only be fixed to BR 1952-built examples. Finally, elongate the hole in the headstocks to take scale couplings if you intend to use them.

#### Weighting the wagon

Kitbuilt wagons are renowned for being too lightweight, and the Parkside 'hybrid high' is no exception. A wagon that will run empty can have a ballast weight fixed under the floor. Liquid lead-type products can be glued into the spaces between the chassis members, but I chose to remove parts of the underfloor ribbing to make space for a weight fashioned from offcuts of roofing lead. A razor saw, sharp cutters, craft knife, and various files will remove the unwanted plastic and the lead can be cut to shape and superglued in place (see photo 3). Once completed, the wagon







tipped the scales at 40g - roughly the same as others on my layout.

Permanent or removable loads are another way of providing extra ballast. Photo 4 shows some of the loads I've made; they have weights concealed inside 'hollowed out' plastic crates and boxes, and underneath the timber. If you choose loads as weights, make sure they're not too heavy; some 'ready to use' resin items definitely are.


#### The interior colours for weathered wood

The unprotected interior timbers soon discoloured by dust, dirt, and various stains. It's best to create this deteriorating appearance before assembly:

Start by giving all the interior planking a beige or dark brown base coat, such as Humbrol matt acrylic 237 Desert Tan (for a relatively new wagon) and 29 Dark Earth (for a more heavily used vehicle). Hand brush or spray to suit your preference.

Leave for a couple of hours, then mix various shades of Humbrol matt acrylic brown, beige, and grey and dry-brush them on top. The central and right-hand sections (see photo 5) show colours being built up. I aimed for light shades on top of the Desert Tan base coat (top) to represent a relatively new wagon. Mid grey-brown hues applied over the

dark earth base coat (bottom) seemed more appropriate for a vehicle that had been in service for a few years.

Dark washes (or dissolved weathering powders or pigments) can be worked into the cracks between the planking to highlight them and indicate trapped dust and debris. As the wash dries, remove any excess liquid and adjust the colours with damp cotton buds and/or a fibre glass pencil (rubbing very gently); as weathering experts say, what you take off can be as important as what you put on



(see photo 6). Older wagons can have several washes applied in order to make them look more work-stained. With a little more precision painting and/or dry-brushing everything blends together. Highlight some of the interior details, such as the strapping and rivets, to finish the interior parts (see photo 7).




#### The exterior the 'part-painted' look

Unfitted 'hybrid highs' were built at a time when workshops were instructed to paint the external metallic surfaces only of open wagons that lacked vacuum brakes. Planking was left bare. Photographs of vehicles with this 'partial' paint scheme can be found in books by Bob Essery and Don Rowland. 'Hybrid highs' kept the part-painted look until they were retrofitted with vacuum brakes in the

mid/late 1950s - as all but nine were. BR bauxite livery was then applied to all of the bodywork. However, after c.1956/7 some (but by no means all) of the dwindling number of unfitted examples did receive overall BR grey - see below.

ance, use the paints, pigments, powders, tools, and techniques described above (see photo 8). Take care not to stray onto the metal surfaces - as I did! - mask them off if necessary. Use Humbrol 237 mixed with a little matt white to represent a few 'new' straw-coloured replacement planks - a common sight in the 1950s. Don't forget to apply the straw colour to the interior of 'new' planks and sections of renewed flooring if these will be visible. Now weather the sides and ends as seen in photo 9,







that has strayed onto the surfaces to be joined, then unite the floor, ends, and sides to create the finished bodywork.

#### Other external liveries

Depending on your choice of era other appropriate colours for the exterior parts should be applied as follows:

Late LMS bauxite - build up thin coats of Phoenix Precision P39, Humbrol 160, or Railmatch 612 on the corrugated ends, corner plates, side stanchions, strapping, and top edges of the doors. The LMS sometimes painted part (or all) of the lower left-hand planks in bauxite as a background for its white running numbers and other wagon data. Weather to taste, following the guidelines above (see photo 10).

BR post-1948 grey - paint the metal surfaces with (for example) Phoenix Precision P126,



Railmatch 2322, Humbrol 64 or 127, Photo 11 shows work in progress. Weather the grey to indicate how recently a vehicle has been painted and how heavily it has been used.

Overall BR grey, mid 1950s onwards photo 12 shows a model with sides and ends coated in Humbrol 127.





#### A chassis for 1952-built BR vehicles


The Parkside parts don't need much work to make them look 'right' for one of the last batches of hybrid highs - the 1952 built BR versions.

Solebars and axleboxes - remove the tiebars then insert the brass bearings. Unfitted vehicles lacked the small vacuum cylinder support brackets (and associated rivets) on both solebars, so these should be cut and filed

Brake gear - these wagons were equipped with only one pair of brake shoes with push rods arranged left over right viewed from an upright position. The lever with the Morton clutch fits onto the V hanger on the same side as the brake shoes.

Other parts - clean up the doorstops and buffer heads and cement in position. Plastic

Weld will fix these ABS plastic items securely. Photo 13 shows the position of all underframe components.

#### A chassis for LMS-built wagons

All the photos I've seen of LMS 'hybrid highs' indicate that they were built with post-1923 RCH w-irons (with triangular cut-outs rather than circular holes) and split oil axleboxes. These components are subtly different from the ones supplied by Parkside. If modellers are prepared to overlook these discrepancies they can, of course, use the Parkside components and assemble the model as detailed above.

#### Alternative axleguards

However, discerning modellers may prefer to fit more accurate axleguards, such as those manufactured by ABS/Fourmost models (ref FU02) or the type supplied with Parkside's RCH five- and seven-plank opens. Cambrian also supplies an RCH/Morton 10' wheelbase chassis kit that will suffice. Full details of how to use these products are beyond the scope of this article, but photo 14 depicts a completed wagon with ABS axleguards so that modellers can appreciate the difference.



#### Using a Ratio chassis

My preferred way of producing an accurate unfitted LMS-designed vehicle is to fit the Parkside sides and modified ends onto a Ratio underframe kit (ref.560). Plank embossed plasticard and 30thou x 30thou microstrip are also required; they can be sourced from Slater's or Evergreen.

As an aside here, note that the Parkside underframe parts don't have to be wasted; they are ideal for upgrading the 'bottom half' of several older R-T-R wagons and vans that have an acceptable body but rudimentary



chassis. Photo 15 shows a Replica BR Medfit modified in this way.

Anyhow back to the Ratio kit adaptation. If you need to fit a ballast weight, file away part (or all) of Ratio's underfloor chassis detail (photo 16). There is now ample space for a rectangle of roofing lead or steel.



Next, cut off the tiebars from the w-irons. Open up the holes for the brass bearings very slightly with a 2mm drill and super-glue the bearings in place. The solebars and floor can now be cemented together. Cement the brakegear in position as shown in photo 17.

The assembled Ratio floor/solebar unit is slightly narrow, so it needs to be widened. This can be done by cementing a length of 30thou x 30thou microstrip to each edge. A piece of plank embossed plasticard cut to the same dimensions as the extended floor should be cemented on top of it (photo 18), unless the entire floor will always be disguised by a load.

Paint and weather the floor planking to match the interior of the sides and ends (as explained above).

Don't try to cement the ends to the floor or sides yet, because you'll need to remove the protruding ridge on the rear of each head-stock (it's 20thou to 30thou thick). Sand away very gradually until each end is a good fit against the edge of the floor and solebars.

To join the body and chassis, start by





cementing both ends into place, making sure that everything is square and lines up correctly. I found it necessary to add small blocks cut from Evergreen styrene (c. 1.5mm x 4mm) to strengthen the joints. The sides should fit snugly between the ends and butt against the floor edge (photo 19). Study Photo 20 to see the remaining underframe components in place. A blend of Phoenix Precision 'frame dirt' (P960) and 'rusty rails' (P977), or Humbrol 186 and 82, can be washed over the black plastic to weather the underframe. The paler colour plus a little weathering powder can be used to represent brake dust and rust deposits.

#### Waterslide decals

Wagon data was usually stencilled onto painted patches (or entire planks) on the bottom



left hand side – LMS bauxite before nationalisation and black under BR. However, on LMS wagons the corner plates sometimes displayed the 13T carrying capacity (left) and tare weight (right). Appropriate running numbers and tare weights for vehicles built as part of specific LMS diagrams are provided in the table in the appendix.

Waterslide transfers by Old Time Workshop (sheet 4701) can be cut up, re-ordered, and applied carefully to vehicles in LMS livery. After nationalisation, smaller BR-style numbering with the 'M' prefix was often superimposed onto repainted bauxite patches. Model Master sheet 4761 provides decals that can be rearranged to depict such post-nationalisation examples, while mini-pack 8038 contains a complete set of numbers and tare weights on black backing patches for a 1952-built vehicle (photo 21). I always apply waterslide decals to a small area coated with a touch of gloss varnish and fix with Microsol. A final light dusting of weathering powder or pigment





(such as Tamiya 'mud') will dull down the transfers, and a light coat of spray matt varnish will protect everything.

#### Final detailing

Couplings and wheels can be weathered in the same way as the underframe (see above), but take care to keep the paint off wheel treads. Gunmetal or a similar oily steel colour painted onto the buffer shanks and dry brushed onto the buffer heads will bring these parts to life. White brake lever handles are an authentic final touch.

Photo 22 shows two completed 'hybrid highs' in late LMS and early BR liveries to highlight the rudimentary brake gear and rather austere grey-brown appearance. These unfitted wagons are ideal for a late 1940s/50s layout and provide an authentic contrast to the more colourful and elaborate vacuum-fitted versions that most modellers will be familiar with (photo 23).

A journey to a far-off time...

# **Towcester**

Photography by Paul Bason

This is the result of a bit of gentle reworking of Midlands railway history in order to maintain rail services to the small Northamptonshire town into the 1970s. JOHN NORTON. **RICHARD COLEMAN & GEORGE WOODCOCK** explain more about this OO exhibit, DCC controlled and recently extended.

he year is 1977 and it is summer in Towcester; in the distance a train's air horn is heard and shortly afterwards a blue Class 101 DMU arrives from the direction of Northampton with a service to Oxford via Banbury. With a squeal of brakes it draws to a halt at the island platform where a handful of passengers alight and even fewer climb aboard. The driver and guard stand together talking as they wait for the approach of a train from the south so they can proceed down the single track line

to Banbury. After a few minutes another air horn is heard as the train passes the last surviving semaphore home signal and soon a Class 25 hauling a short parcels train from Oxford to Leicester enters the

climb aboard and as the colour light signal changes to green the buzzer sounds for the right-away. The unit heads south noisily, going through the gears as it accelerates along the embankment to the south of the A5


Shortly afterwards the Class 25 gets the guard's signal to proceed and moves slowly forward, pausing to let the driver take the token from the signalman as it passes the box. Satisfied that all is in order, the driver opening the throttle; the Sulzer engine bellows as the train passes the green light and heads north to Blisworth where it will join the WCML, destination Northampton.

Never let the truth


routes including the legendary SMJ - the Stratford-upon-Avon & Midland Junction line that ran to Stratford and Evesham. Other lines went to Banbury, Blisworth and Olney via Ravenstone Junction on the Bedford to Northampton line.

Sadly none of these lines were ever very profitable and the passenger services were withdrawn in the early 1950s though freight lingered on until final closure in 1964. The last services mainly conveyed iron ore to Woodford Halse which was the junction with the Great Central line. This too was to close a couple of years later.





In the imagined scenario, passenger trains serve the route, such as from Reading to Nottingham; this Class 47 is northbound with a rake of Mk.I coaches, cautiously negotiating the crossover south of the station.



Almost immediately after closure the bridge over the A5, known locally as the Lucas Bridge due to the adverts for the well-known electrical parts supplier to the motor industry, was demolished as was the signal box and all the track was lifted. The station buildings hung on a for a bit longer and the goods shed lasted until the mid-90s.

The site was then used for the erection of a large factory unit for local engineers Groom & Tattershall which had had another factory across the other side of the old Tiffield Road. The company ceased trading later, so the site was again cleared and eventually was used as a Tesco supermarket.


Very few traces remain of the railway though the bridge over the Olney branch is still *in situ* but is closed to vehicles these days. The abutments' banks where the railway bridge carried the line over the A5 are still visible as is the embankment that carried the line south.


#### It's story time again

Our partner in crime John Norton lives within sight of the embankment; one day he told us that he would like to build a layout of Towcester. We agreed, although as none of us has much interest in steam traction we decided to play the game of 'what if?' again and set the layout in 1977.

This meant playing with history as well as the station area itself, but as long as the research is done well and there is a plausible scenario for the location then all will be well. The two lines that went south over the Lucas bridge looked like a







double track main line but were in fact two single track branches that divided at Green's Norton Junction. The left one went to Banbury and the right one - the old SMJ went to Stratford; as mentioned earlier the Banbury line closed in the 1950s. In our parallel universe we altered that as it made more sense to have the Banbury line still open, providing an alternative route to the south coast and also the southeast.

The line to Blisworth provides a route to the WCML to Northampton with a link via the Market Harborough line to the East Midlands and the north. The line to Olney has long closed as a through route but is still used for conveying timber from Salcey Forest.

The original scenic part of the layout was 10' long with two 5' fiddle yards. The scenic breaks at the north end were the bridge over the Olney line and the cutting heading to Blisworth going through the 'hole in the sky'. The southern end was another hole in the sky where the two tracks merged into one heading to Banbury with the SMJ remaining rusted and overgrown.

We simplified the track plan by leaving out most of the sidings that had existed in real life but which in our version had been removed and rationalised. We built the station in low relief to save space, although the platform is still to scale; the same is true of the island platform. Trains pass north through the station platform and south to the left of the island platform. When the passenger services were withdrawn from the

real Towcester the footbridge was removed as was the southbound track on the right of the island platform. As the tracks are signalled bi-directionally the station platform is used in both directions.

Cable ducting has replaced the original telegraph posts and this has been laid down in the cleared trackbed through the station. Ratio kit which bears an astonishing

other structures, goods shed, station building, platforms, signal box, bridges, are scratchbuilt. The only building on the layout that is fictional is the Towcester Mill and Trading Company warehouse which is on the



site of the old turntable. The goods shed is now in the hands of Groome & Tattershall just as in real life, although the old office is used as a signing on point for the handful of train crew based in Towcester.

We are much indebted to John Evans who took some of the very few colour pictures of Towcester station around the time of closure and without these we would have struggled to make the buildings so accurately. John is the brother of Nick Evans who owns the Model Shop in Northampton which has supplied not only a lot of the materials for this layout but our others as well. Thanks to them as well.

The signals were originally semaphores but have now been replaced with colour lights supplied by Train-Tech; such is progress.

The layout was our first excursion into the wonderful world of DCC which in our case consists of NCE equipment bought second-hand from our friend Brendan Walsh with many thanks to our esteemed colleague Kev Dickerson of Coastal DCC. The points and signals are however controlled by 12V dc using a control panel John built mounted on the rear of the layout. The locos and units are all sound chipped and jolly fine they are too; more thanks to Kev. The signage on the station and particularly the Lucas Bridge are made by Trackside signs.




#### The trains pass through

We are now in true fantasy land as no diesel powered trains ever operated through Towcester except for one DMU special in the early 1960s. As we are now in 1977 we feature many DMUs and locomotives that have long passed into history themselves but we have tried to keep a sense of realism in the types we feature and also the services they operate.

Passenger workings are predominantly in the hands of first generation DMUs such as classes 101, 105, 108 and 122. Services include Leicester to Oxford, Northampton to Didcot, Northampton to Banbury, Towcester to Northampton and even the odd service ▲ Class 33/1 No.33 110 is a long way from its normal Bournemouth – Weymouth stamping ground as it runs north with Presflos.

through to Reading. There are a small number of locomotive hauled services using Mk.I stock and Type 2 and Type 4 haulage such as Reading to Nottingham and Didcot to Leicester.

There is still freight traffic into Towcester yard which includes steel coils for the Groom & Tattershall plant from South Wales or the West Midlands carried on converted Bogie Bolster Cs, plus fertiliser and animal feed for

ministratur faransala in in mil TMT from Avonmouth and Heysham carried in various types of 12T vans. These services run as part of a daily pickup goods train from Northampton to Banbury though occasionally the steel coils come via Banbury. The timber traffic from Salcey Forest is carried in the fairly new air-braked OBA wagons. This is often hauled by a pair of Class 20s though Class 25s make the odd appearance. These mainly run round in the station before departing to Northampton and onwards to Bescot; these also sometimes run to Banbury.

Through traffic is varied with services often running overnight when passenger services have ceased to avoid congestion on the single track lines. Mail traffic is a major source of revenue on the line with services running to and from Paddington, Derby, Southampton, Oxford, Banbury, Leicester, Northampton and Towcester itself. The latter traffic is often in the hands of a Class 128 DPU which berths in the short bay platform at the Blisworth end of the station. Also, odd vans are dropped off and picked up from there by passing loco hauled trains.

Two trains that regularly pass through Towcester bring the unusual sight of BRCW Class 33s to the line; the first is the Tring to Halling cement traffic conveyed in Presflo wagons and the other is the Fawley to Northampton petroleum traffic conveyed for Esso in TTV tank wagons.

classes 20, 25, 33, 40, 46 and 47, all of which would have worked in this area at that time though sadly not at Towcester. Also the train described are a mix of real and fictional

Towcester. Also the trains described are a mix of real and fictional workings though they could all have been possible if the story was real.

#### We take the high road

After a couple of years on

the exhibition circuit we decided to extend the layout by adding another 5' board to the southern end. The idea was to give the sound chipped trains a chance to show off their efforts, especially in this direction. The DMUs in particular would be able to go through their gear sequences to better effect. The work involved was not too difficult, though we did have to do a bit of jiggery-pokery moving the end board to the new board to keep the height correct as it entered the fiddle yard.

The first job was to cut the course of the River Tove in the baseboard and after lowering it then to build the bridge over it; this was fairly easy as the original was still in place and we only had to copy it. The track bed was made from a length of 6mm ply and then expanded foam was used to make the banking after carving it when dry.

The river was made using Solid Water from Deluxe Materials with its Making Waves used for the ripples. Reeds and gravel were put in place before adding the water material; we made sure to apply bathroom sealant around the edges to prevent it running out.

along the board to a buffer stop, and Richard made up a splendid selection of condemned wagons rusting away quietly. In real life the line to Ravenstone Junction had been used for this purpose; they remained there for many years after the lines closed. The other object on the line is a Dapol home signal controlling access to the station.

With this extension we felt the layout was now complete, though like most, there are always little things to change or add.

#### And finally a big hand for...

...all the people who have helped/provided information during the building of the layout and have not already had a mention. Firstly we would like to thank the SMJ Society, which John and George both joined, for information on the line and Towcester in particular. Also to Simon and Dave who were the other members of the Wrecking Crew at the time, and to Paul Wade who is a member now and helps operate the layout on many occasions.

Many thanks and lots of love to The Cloud Lady who painted the backscene and who we doubt we will ever see again. To Mick Bryan for his help with DCC issues while we are on the road, George's neighbour Iris for making the curtain and Jo at Arnold Signs for the rather beautiful Towcester sign.

Finally to all the exhibition managers who have booked the layout and all the people who have come to see the layout and said a lot of nice things about it.

# Wrington Vale station building

Whilst looking back over our 70 years of continuous publication, we came across a scale drawing by W Hardin Osborne of this structure which created a bit of a stir when it was first published in the July 1965 RAILWAY MODELLER. STEVE CROUCHER updates the scale drawing, with notes by STEVE FLINT.

here is a notion which circulates amongst the modelling fraternity that argues it ought to be as easy to get it right as it is to get it wrong: 'it' being the finished work, be it a model, a drawing, or commercial product.

The notion implies that there are no excuses for inaccuracies. After all, it's just a matter of observing everything carefully, isn't it?

Personally I don't agree, I think it is always harder to get something right. The checking and verification process alone will always require more time and more resources, such as another pair of eyes. Moreover how would anyone know that something might be missing without taking the additional time and effort necessary to check all the facts?

I am sure that most modellers do not set out deliberately to do things wrong, but offer their work in good faith. Yet woe betide them if they inadvertently publish an error: the next postbag will inevitably contain a correction, and sometimes even a reprimand


That's exactly what happened when RAILWAY MODELLER originally published W Hardin Osborne's drawing featuring Wrington Vale station in the July 1965 issue.

The drawing was clearly a compromise, but it so incensed a Mr Alan Wright from Newton-le-Willows that he drew his own version and sent it in with a letter expressing how he was really annoyed "...at seeing such glaring errors published in the MODELLER." Some things never change! His letter and revised drawing appeared in the September 1965 issue.

The real station was located at Wrington on the Wrington Vale Light Railway which was opened in 1901; it ran between Congresbury and the terminus at Blagdon in Somerset.

Perhaps, as part of our 70th anniversary year, now is as good a time as any to print an updated and corrected version of the drawing. This is based on our own survey of the similar surviving building at Blagdon, which actually suggests that even Alan Wright's 1965 drawing was not correct either!

Are you sure you've no space for a layout?

## **Milton Street**

Inspired by a photograph of a Class 08 in a yard headshunt, **RICHARD CHAPMAN** created this small N gauge layout using equipment and scenery from an earlier model. Ironically, of the loco fleet that operate his layout, the 08s are currently sidelined pending attention...

When we start looking for a new project, from where do we draw our inspiration? Maybe it's a childhood memory, an everyday view or even a desire for it to be a prototype location. We are all different in our opinions.

Mine usually come from a photograph found in a publication of either a loco, an item of stock, or sometimes an image with no trains at all. It was one of these that started off the ideas for *Milton Street*.

The view I had in my mind was of a

grubby Class 08 sat in weeds at the end of a headshunt, viewed through the road side railings. All of this turned out to be timely as Graham Farish was about to release

its new outside frame 08

cry from the old Poole-era one.

So with all this, sketches were made and eventually a plan was drawn up. This in fact ended up similar to a layout built some 15 years ago by Jeff Taylor called *Alloa Goods*. The resulting plan did not include a run round loop and so was another good reason for the 08.

To stock the layout the plan was to rewheel appropriate models from my retired (now scrapped) 2FS layout. These have been subsequently supplemented with a number of the more recent releases.

#### Boards/track/wiring

Construction of the single 4' x 1' board, of which 3' is scenic, was from sheet material that I already had in the workshop at the time. This turned out to be an amalgamation of both 9mm ply and MDF.



undercoated and the top surfaces painted in blue and underneath in gloss white.

The last thing was to construct a slot-together underframe with adjustable feet. This included a stock shelf at the rear of the layout.

Trackwork used was Peco code 55 in conjunction with medium radius electrofrog points. The points were trimmed down around the tiebar area and the over-centre springs removed.

All trackwork including that on the sector plate was laid on cork.

Point control is via GEM wire-in-tube and

lock the point in place.


The layout was wired from cable reclaimed from the previous layout along with four DG magnets to operate the couplings.

A small box was used to house the section switches and push buttons. This was connected to the layout via a permanent umbilical cord which was long enough to reach the front and rear.

The three-road sector plate was fitted with its own isolating switches.

All transformers were mounted in a metal box and control is via an old AMR switched

feedback controller with shunt facility. I have had two of these for some years and wish they were still around.

An issue that did arise during testing, was that short wheelbase stock dropped into the point vees, this was because over the past few years manufacturers have improved the wheel standards and reduced the flange size.


However the larger flanges were the very thing that helped the older stock through the pointwork. So even with the improved wheelsets the point geometry cannot be

So the solution was to make some 5thou plasticard vees to fit in the points and greatly reduce the issue. With these in place all was tested again and once satisfactory attention could be turned to the track itself.

All the hardstanding areas were filled in with mounting card and the trackwork ballasted using Woodland Scenics fine chippings. This was held in place using a mixture of varnish and thinners; a method I had seen used by the guys who built *Stoke Summit* etc and which I have now used myself a few times with good results.

Once all was dry, the layout was cleaned and tested and then sprayed with Railmatch track colour.



The layout in its entirety; a generic factory scene can be relocated in space and time as the whims of stock purchases dictate.

In the coal siding, the sleeper spaces were filled in with air-dry clay, and once set this was painted using acrylic paints. Pathways were also created using the same material.

All hardstanding and road surfaces were created using painted lining paper pre-cut to size and then glued down.

Paving and kerb stones were scribed onto mounting board and painted in the same manner.

the previous layout, the obvious choice was to construct the new items in the same way.

The basic shell was constructed using mounting card and this then had Howard Scenics brick paper glued to the required surfaces. This is an excellent product but due to the sheet size, planning is required for the joints. I used small amounts of Mig weathering powders to take the edge off the shiny surface.

All coping stones, edges etc were also made from card and painted with acrylics. Gutters and downpipes were made from brass tube and channel.

Finally the iron railings along the road side and factory/works are again reclaimed. These originally came from Scale Link.

#### Scenery

For the small amount of scenery that was required I used mainly products from Woodland Scenics, Noch and static grasses from International Models. The static grasses were applied using a Noch Puffer bottle.

Any extra scenic items required came from either Ratio in the form of barrels and pallets or were scratchbuilt.

#### Locomotives and rolling stock

At present locomotives come from both Graham Farish and Dapol and I have found no issues with the modern mechanisms and the old feedback controllers.

As the large building to be used in the works/
factory area was a reclaimed item also from

Less is more – add some small details and cames, but don't overfill the scene and loss the spaciousness that a small layout needs.

The one loco that is missing is the 08. On release two were purchased but I found that the over-width cranks caught on track details and mine also seem to suffer from poor running and pickups. Both have been sidelined pending possible rebuilds.

So currently, the roster stands at 26, 20, 25 and two 24s. All of these have had their pipework fitted and discs where appropriate. All are fitted with DG couplings.

With the Class 25 I decided, as my trackwork allowed, to attempt to portray the missing strengthening bars that come from behind the buffer beams. These are not 100% accurate but help to fill the gap.

Space and ability (for now) dictate that I cannot use an airbrush, so the locos were weathered using acrylic paints and powders

mainly from the AK, Lifelike and Tamiya ranges. This was with the aid of accompanying photos in an attempt to obtain the best results possible using the skills I have at this time.

These are far from what some people achieve, but I am fairly happy with the results so far. The one thing that is left to be done, is for the wheel faces on all locos and pickups to be painted at some stage.

For now most of the wagons were obtained from either Peco or Graham Farish along with a few kitbuilt items. There are also a couple of Dapol models and two of the new Revolution Trains B tanks.

▲ The locomotives and stock are fitted with DG couplings, which allow hands-free operation and delayed uncoupling.

#### Finally

So the question is, did the final result live up to the original plan? Well apart from the 08 shunters yes it did; it gave me a small layout to run items as and when required.

The truth is, though, *Milton Street* has rarely been used at home, although it has ventured out of its box at exhibitions a couple of times, and I would like to thank my two good friends for their help on these occasions. Both Darren Holmes and Paul Steadmen are professional railwaymen, although I am not sure about some of their shunting!

As to the future... this is uncertain as currently storage space is short even for such a small layout and as micro/plank layouts are not everybody's cup of tea at exhibitions, I am not sure it will see any more use. So it may be put up for sale or dismantled.



# Class 123 in 2FS

In search of a train that would be recognisable in an instant on his Yorkshire based terminus in 2FS, ALAN WHITEHOUSE used

We are all used to the idea that certain 'signature' items can be used on a model railway to suggest a time and a place. And that is certainly true of the trains themselves: little sets the location and period of a model better than the rolling stock. So when I was roughly half-way through building my current 2mm finescale (2FS) layout Hallam Town, I began thinking about a 'signature train' to operate on it.

Hallam Town began life as a self-imposed challenge to build a working finescale model railway over a weekend, and is based on the Cyril Freezer classic 'Minories' plan. This can, of course, become whatever you want it to be and I quickly decided on a 1970s,

South Yorkshire BR Eastern Region theme.

So some rolling stock decisions were already made: the layout would be operated primarily by DMUs. But looking for something to set it apart a little from the usual run of Class 108s and 101s, I decided that a Trans-Pennine unit would be a great addition.

Now, BHE Enterprises produces a kit for the Class 123 – the former Swindon Inter-City units that became part of the Trans-Pennine fleet in 1977 when all 10 units were transferred to Hull. But I was not optimistic about my ability to recreate the BR blue & grey livery. Still, it provided cab ends and underfloor detail.

I considered chopping up Graham Farish Mk.ls, cutting and shutting to get doors and windows in all the right places. This has been successfully achieved in 4mm scale, but it felt less achievable in 2mm – the sawcuts

are the same width so the margin for error is twice as small!

A conversation with the proprietor of Electra Railway Graphics, Adam Warr, led to him producing vinyl coach sides to apply to the old-style Farish clear plastic bodyshells. They now form part of his range, available in both BR green and blue & grey liveries.

The Cross-Country (and the Trans-Pennine Class 124) were built to the same length as locohauled Mk.I stock, so the Farish Mk.Is are the correct length. Although long out of production,

they are still readily available on the second-hand market for around \$12-\$15.

### Construction begins – the trailers

Armed with these, my bag of BHE bits and a drawing, I set to work. The two trailers are easy conversion jobs: The underframe detail and trussing is removed and replaced with a battery box, generator and air reservoir – all that these vehicles carried.

The coach bodies were treated to a vigorous rub-down with car paint finisher (T-Cut or similar) to remove the original livery, leaving behind a clear plastic shell. A word of warning: I found that if using a chocolate & cream



#### The BR Swindon Class 123 DMUs

This class of 10 DMUs was built at Swindon, five of them with buffet cars, being intended to give an 'Inter-City' ambience for cross-country services on the Western Region. They entered service in 1963.

They had a distinctive appearance: few first-generation DMUs had gangways in the cab ends, and the 123s were additionally fitted with wrap-around windscreens.

Initially deployed on South Wales – South Coast services, they were later used on many routes including Bristol – Penzance and Swansea – Cardiff – Birmingham. They were switched to outer suburban services from Paddington before being transferred to Hull in 1977 to join the Class 124 Trans-Pennine fleet.

The buffet cars had long since been dispensed with and at Hull the entire fleet of 123 and 124 units were reformed into four-car sets. Initially the classes were kept in formation, but gradually 'hybrid' sets began appearing.

Starting in 1979 some sets were modified with the train reporting number display boxes being removed and replaced by marker lights. Some also received 'Trans-Pennine' branding on one of the driving vehicles. Both classes were withdrawn in 1984, and nothing remains of either DMU fleet today.

coach, an outline of all the window apertures was left behind. This looked almost like a faint shadow. I have no idea what causes it, but sticking with other liveries might be wise.

Choosing later-build coaches is also helpful for this conversion because the Cross-Country sets, like later loco-hauled Mkls, ran on B4 bogies. And I remembered to buy a brake coach for the DMBS vehicle! Although I was going to be taking the bodysides back to clear plastic, the roof will

have the correct (or almost correct) set of ventilators.

The Electra vinyl sides were then simply applied onto the clear plastic, taking care to line up the ends of coach and vinyl and to exclude any air bubbles as I went along. I found it helpful to work at a slight diagonal, applying the vinyl from the top comer, working along and down at the same time.

The roof of the corridor composite was reworked slightly to get the lavatory filler and pipework in the right place. Then the roofs were resprayed two subtly different shades of grey (a complete train never, ever, had roofs all the same colour) and that was it, job done.

#### The driving motor cars

These two vehicles were a different story, as on the Class 123 both were powered. I had originally intended to use a Farish 4-CEP powered chassis for one and then to create a dummy, with appropriate underfloor detail, for


the other. This plan foundered because I was unable to make the CEP chassis fit the Poole-era coach bodyshell.

The eventual answer was a pair of Dapol Class 121 chassis, powered and dummy. These units were also the same length as a standard Mk.I coach, so that was one thing less to worry about.

I took a bodyshell and chaindrilled around the floor pan, using a craft knife to cut it out, leaving only a small area at each end which was drilled to take a

12BA screw. The top side of this hole was gently countersunk and a nut superglued in place. A corresponding hole was drilled straight through the Dapol chassis. The screw was inserted underneath and passed through the chassis and coach floor before screwing into the captive nut, giving a firm fixing between the two.

The coach sides were measured, compared to the vinyls and one end cut off at the appropriate length to accept the BHE cab end. This was not an easy marriage. A good deal of filing, scraping and offering-up and filling was needed to get an acceptable fit. The cab ends were themselves also heavily modified, with the gangway ends being filed right back so that this relatively crude detailing could be replaced with a present-day Farish plastic moulding. The train reporting number boxes were also filed off and replacement lamp housings made using 14BA washers as the basis. The Class 123s were modified from 1979 onwards, so this is really a modification too far for a 70s-based model but I think they looked rather better in this guise.

The Dapol underfloor detail was left untouched, even though it is not entirely correct for the Class 123. Perhaps a project for another day...

Units were changed around in later years, some vehicles being

But the bogies definitely needed attention. The Class 121 bogie is nothing like the B4 (the actual powered bogies were B5s but the differences between that and the B4 are minimal). I removed the sideframes from Farish B4 bogies and filed them down from behind as thinly as I could. The Dapol bogies were similarly filed down, removing all the sideframe details. The two were then laminated using two-part epoxy and firmly clipped together to set.

The bogies were reassembled, painted and weathered. The roofs were cut to length and joined to the dome of the cab front, with a little modelling putty being used to fill the inevitable gaps. Suitably smoothed off, they were reworked where necessary to get ventilators in the correct places, and painted.

#### Fine detailing

Exhaust pipes were bent up from brass wire. NEM coupler boxes were fitted to all the inner coach ends and Dapol short couplers plugged in to bring the buffers as close together as possible. Note that they should not actually touch as the buckeye couplers used on the real thing meant that buffer heads were retracted.

Gangways from N Brass were made up to eliminate daylight between each coach. I found that one unit between two coach ends worked well. If you wanted them to go around sharpish curves, they are easily shortened.

Finally, because this is a 2FS model, the trailer vehicles had their wheels replaced with 2mm Association coach wheelsets and the two driving coaches had their Dapol wheels turned down to 2FS standards.

#### Conclusion

The secret of using vinyl sides is to apply them as late as possible in the build: They are delicate and scratch easily. So, for example the cab ends were painted and glazed, screen wipers added and full bufferbeam detail built up first. (One of the joys of running DMUs is that they do not need to be able to couple to anything else, so all this detailing was possible.)

One major issue with vinyls is lack of surface relief:

everything is dead flat. To try to counter this I added door handles and grab rails, and cab and guard compartment handrails. I considered scoring the vinyls along the door lines but decided this might be a step too far.

This all took a bit longer than I expected. Is the result worth the effort? The answer is a qualified 'yes'. The vinyl sides cannot match a modern plastic moulding, but they look reasonable enough used in isolation - a DMU for example - but I would not want to use them in a mixed rake of stock.


On the other hand, they give you the ability to create a train that you will not be buying over the counter anytime soon. And that, for me at least, is worth a lot.



## **Ventnor West**

with the direct route from Portsmouth via Ryde, despite the shorter walk to the sea at Ventnor. Although the plan had originally been to get closer to the centre of Ventnor, it never came to fruition. Competition between the two routes was absurd when what was really needed was a funicular from Ventnor station to sea level.

In 1952 the Ventnor West branch became the first of the island lines to close. Ventnor station was closed at the end of 1966 when the line from Ryde was truncated at Shanklin. After a considerable period of decay and decline, the town now seems to be finding its feet and once again has an air of optimism and growth.

#### Inspiration

Ventnor West was conceived as an extension to the model of Merstone built by my friend Mark Pretious, which has been on the exhibition circuit since 2016. This in turn had been started by the late Rod Lerew, a

member of our local club (Alton Model Railway Group) who had sold the baseboards and some of the trackwork to Mark. I worked pretty much solo on *Ventnor West* for about 12 months. It cannot be operated by itself as there is nothing beyond the 'hole in the sky' through which trains enter and exit.

The obvious way to model Ventnor West would be to view it from the seaward side, with the cliff providing a natural backscene. Because of the orientation of *Merstone* however we were forced to model the station from the other side, looking out to sea. To achieve this on a flat baseboard needed a *trompe l'oeil*.


Mark helped me in adapting the baseboards at the start so that the backscene stood 1" or so back from the baseboard surface. He also painted the splendid view of the sea in the distance. I built a 'ha-ha' at the edge of the flat baseboard, and planted it with trees to provide tantalising glimpses of the sea in between. Mark also captured the essence of Steephill Castle, a landmark on the approach to the station, which was demolished in the 1960s.


No.28 Ashey has arrived with a train from Newport to find Southern Vectis opposition in the forecourt.

In October 2017 we exhibited the combined layout for the first time. Generally speaking, I ration public appearances of *Ventnor West* to around two a year. I'm a firm believer in 'less is more' and apart from anything else it all becomes more of an effort the older one gets! Nothing remains the same for long, and as I write, Mark is working on plans to add another section covering St Lawrence and the stone quarry at Ventnor which will extend the *trompe l'oeil* another 10' or so towards Merstone and we hope will provide the viewer with an impression of a spacious panorama from the cliff top on this most marvellous piece of coastal scenery.

#### Compression

Whilst I hope the model captures the essence of Ventnor West, it is not completely accurate. I embarked on building it as a





diversion from an ambitious loft layout comprising Cowes, Newport and Medina Wharf which is still in the bare baseboard stage. I wanted to build Ventnor West within a year and I started with ready-made baseboards (Model Railway Solutions kits), which I bought second-hand from a friend. I had to compress the layout into a space of 10' x 2'. I removed about 2' from the station throat, as well as having to put the goods shed on the wrong siding (where I happen to think it looks rather good). None of this bothers me as I think compressed layouts generally look better than full scale ones. This may be because in real life one usually has a partial view from a platform, a bridge, or the lineside and so one has a distorted

view of how sprawling the real thing can be.

In hindsight I realise I might have done better by building it on three 4' boards, because mine are too long to be handled and transported easily. I also made some mistakes as I didn't have all the information I needed at the start. I completely missed out the cattle dock (I could yet add it) and I got the lie of the land at the bufferstop end completely wrong. It was only after I had finished the layout that I managed to obtain the official British Railways site plan. D'oh!

#### Locos and rolling stock


I do find the Isle of Wight a convenient hook on which to hang my modelling activity. As a self-contained network with an intensive service, the island's railways were very similar to most model railways. The short trains take up less space and suit a compact layout. The limited range of locos and stock and the fact that very little of it is available ready-to-run could be seen as disadvantages but they are a useful brake on expenditure. They focus one's horizon, they discourage impulse purchases and 'scope creep', and I do enjoy the discipline and reward of recreating a real location.

Until very recently, modellers of the IoW railways have had to build everything they need from kits or from scratch. That changed with the arrival of the Kernow Model Rail Centre O2, which is an excellent model. Today's models are not all built with maintenance and repair in mind and there is no source of spares for these locos. I still prefer to build my own models because I believe they will be more durable and they certainly give me more pleasure.


I have five Kernow O2s, bought as an expedient, and they will be supplemented or even replaced by kitbuilt locos in time. I have three of those in operational condition, with more in various stages of completion.


Ex-LBSCR carriages are mostly kitbashed from Ratio Midland suburban coaches. I also have some brass kits and have developed my own kit of laser-cut plastic parts for the SECR carriages, which marry with Bill Bedford brass sides. Wagons are generally kits, with a few from Wessex Wagons, which whilst not accurate models, have again been expedient and introduce private owner liveries to the otherwise rather drab freight stock. Apart from that, nearly all of my locos and stock are in BR period liveries (1949 – 1966).

#### **Trackwork**

Track is to the OO gauge 'intermediate' standard and is a mixture of C&L plain track and handmade pointwork using Timbertracks sleeper bases and C&L chairs. Points are operated by Cobalt Omega switch units which I have found reasonably quiet, reliable and fairly easy to fit. Signals are mostly from Model Signal Engineering components and I use a Megapoints servo controller to operate them.

The layout has been wired with both digital and analogue control in mind and operates in analogue mode when joined to *Merstone*. My ultimate ambition is to use


Protocab wireless remote control, and I am waiting impatiently for the price of small Li-Lon batteries to come down for this to become reality. Couplings are Sprat & Winkle from Model Signal Engineering, although I have switched from the firm's uncoupling magnets to Kadees, which are bigger and easier to operate from the front of the layout where there is a considerable parallax error involved in positioning stock for uncoupling.

#### Scenery and buildings

The main scenic features of the layout, apart from the distant sea view, are probably the trees. There are nearly 100.1 tried many

methods of construction before lighting on Seamoss and Gaugemaster 'scenic leaves' as being a good balance between speed, ease of building and realism. The downside (perhaps) of the orientation of the layout is that the trees obscure the line coming into the station, and more particularly the three-arm signal at the station throat which I am quite proud of!

The buildings, apart from the lamp huts,

are scratchbuilt. I use plywood frames as the basis, laser-cut from my own 2D CAD artwork, with stonework from Scalescenes, printed on matt adhesive vinyl. CAD was quite a learning experience for an old brain but it provides a route to better buildings than I can construct by wielding a craft knife.

Through the layout I have made a number of friends. One of them is Godfrey Glyn, who helps out in my local model shop, Alton Model Centre. The shop, managed by Paul Treacher, has been unfailingly helpful in supplying my more extreme modelling requirements with endless patience, good


humour and cups of tea. It turned out that as a boy, Godfrey had lived in the house (Little Pax) which still overlooks the site of Ventnor West station and which had been built in the 17th century as the summer house of the Governor of the Isle of Wight. With his help I have been able to construct a convincing replica.


#### Operation

Operationally, Ventnor West was quite dull. Traffic was sparse and in later years pretty much restricted to a push-pull service which ran from a siding at Merstone. When exhibiting we stretch reality and operate a much busier service, including through trains from Newport. As the layout is currently stocked from my loft layout, the rolling stock and locos are drawn from a wider pool than would have been seen on the branch in real life. Open wagons have removable loads so that coal can flow into Ventnor West, sandstone from Ventnor Quarry towards Merstone via Ventnor West, and sugar beet originates at Ventnor West. There are some chalk loads in Blue Circle wagons, but I have not yet worked out where they are going or coming from! My excuse is that they look nice. In time I would like to extend the time period back to the days of the Isle of Wight Central Railway. I will certainly never be

short of locomotive and rolling stock projects.

My priorities in a layout are mainly to do with operation: complete reliability, hands-free operation from a single seated position, automatic uncoupling, realistic traffic flows, and interlocked signals and points. The last of these will come when I build the Modratec lever frame which is not quite at the front of the queue for my attention. I would also like to add a system of bell codes for passing traffic between *Ventnor West* and *Merstone* and have an old Tri-ang bell signal set awaiting its call to duty.


#### Conclusion

The layout has been satisfying to build and I am pleased with the result. I do intend to improve a number of aspects of operation and presentation. Running to a sequence or timetable would be a start, and I would like to adopt a waybill system for generating freight flows. As a teenager I was enthralled by Cliff Young's description in the November 1966 RM of the operation of freight on his Denver & Rio Grande layout.

I do also like the idea of a recorded commentary for the train service, but realise it could get wearing in an exhibition context. I operate from the front and when we are waiting for a train I tell the audience what is happening and why (usually along the lines of "we are the end of the branch, there aren't many passengers and the timetable is sparse!"). It does give them a reason to stay to see the next train and it often leads to other questions about the layout whilst we are waiting. Even long-time enthusiasts are often surprised to find out that there was 'another' station at Ventnor.

### **Talking Points**

Topical issues from the world of model railways

#### Getting it right - have we lost our modelling heritage?

Tony Wright asks if there is indeed a straight and true way forward for the hobby?



'm privileged to be invited to many shows as a demonstrator/loco doctor/photographer/judge, and at one exhibition last year a visitor came along and, seemingly with great delight, shoved a brand-new ready-to-run loco under my nose.

"Isn't this the way forward?" he proclaimed. "Just look at how good it is." The identity of the model itself doesn't matter (though it was very good), but I hope the chap wasn't offended by my response.

"No, at least not for me." as I pointed out all the locomotive models I'd made on display by my bench. I wasn't claiming my models were necessarily any better, but telling him that making a model with my own hands was far more important to me than just buying a ready-to-run model, or having ones made for me. "All you've done is to buy that," was my parting comment as he trudged off, a bit crestfallen, if his gait was an indicator.

'Proper' modelling, not box-opening, in the shape of *Bradwell* in P4 built by members of the Manchester MRS in the 1990s – a generation ago.



However, it did set me thinking about what the way forward for our hobby actually is. Being a multi-facetted activity, there must be many 'forward' paths available to us, though some might be dead-end ones! Surely though, one significant path to follow must be the encouragement of folk to have a go at making models, however humble, for themselves. That is the point of modelling demonstrators at shows, and it's what the RM has always proclaimed 'Shows You How!'

The abundance of good quality R-T-R models is actually one positive step forward. One's starting point is now so good that even the determined beginner or totally inexperienced modeller can personally modify/improve/alter/detail/weather, and make a great job.

Time was when improving an R-T-R product meant, among many other things, carving off handrails, re-wheeling, sometimes even making replacement chassis, and certainly a repaint.

Most of those modifications required a fair bit of skill, so at least the excellence of today's out-of-the-box items (in all scales/gauges) means

that personalising them is now well within the skill-set of many more individuals. That must be a good thing – a worthy way forward? Yes I think so, but there are those that bleat, they claim that a good model can be ruined. I argue that this hobby should be a constructional, creative activity, not a passive one – leave that to the collectors who wish to keep their models pristine and in their boxes.

#### Traditional railway modelling is lost

I think in recent years the hobby has moved away from the sort of model railway which always seemed to interest enthusiasts the most. By those, I mean layouts featuring complex track formations, working mechanical signalling, locomotive-hauled passenger trains, proper freight traffic, etc., true and accurate renditions of our bygone railways.

All that seems at least a generation or more ago now, although odd pockets still remain. Look at a magazine or visit a show and we seem to be overwhelmed by a plethora of digitally controlled and excessively contrived just supposing layouts; all of which end up looking – and sounding – exactly the same.

#### Passing on artisan skills

Returning to demonstrating, it is very important that best practices are shown (although I do admit to adopting my teacher-mode of 'Do as I say, not as I do!' at times when explaining things). Unless creative artisan skills are passed on, I feel the only path is a backwards one in the hobby. Yes, there are exciting new processes appearing all the time, like laser cutting and 3-D printing, but they require computer software and associated skills, but I don't believe that computers however sophisticated would be able to do all the things necessary in the building of a model railway.

That's why I think the demonstrational aspect of model making by hand is so important. And, passing on skills is not just about demonstrating, it's also about the advice given in the media, in all its modern forms.

#### Getting things right

There is a huge responsibility to 'get things right', especially with describing how to make things and, particularly, when undertaking historical research. Having written several books in the last three years showing (mainly my) pictures of BR's operations from 30-50 years ago, I've had to really strive to make sure my captions are as accurate as possible, (though still the inevitable blooper scraped through).

There will be no path forward if authors writing historical works and demonstrators offering advice on building model railways don't get things as correct as they can, ensuring that accurate information is passed on.

Yet, and I'm on my hobby horse now, I despair at seeing some of the stuff offered as 'forward-looking' advice. Do some modellers never look at historical pictures of what they're trying to recreate? Howlers I've seen in the media more recently include layouts depicting Settle & Carlisle track plans with facing crossovers at through stations [Ed. usual prototype practice was to avoid facing points on main lines,

although in modern times this has been relaxed], a layout intended to inspire beginners with a signal box placed at 45° to the track because "...it looked more interesting like that..." Platforms made so high that carriage doors could not be opened, non-working semaphore signals or signals placed in ludicrous positions, a lack of trap points, steam-hauled trains running without loco in the centre of a train of non-gangwayed stock and even advice on gluing etched brass kits together because folk are 'scared' of soldering. Oh dear.

What hope is there for those newcomers who copy such mistakes, omissions and anachronsims?

My own preference is always to model an actual prototype location, but I appreciate that many, because of space restrictions or lack of accurate information, choose a fictional location. If you must, then my plea is at least try and observe prototype practice, otherwise even the best formulated might-have-been layout, loses its credibility.

Could it be that some don't care how inaccurate their research and model-making might be? If that's the case, and if they form the majority of opinion, then I fear there'll be no way forward. What will happen if newcomers, eager to learn skills and soak up information, are ill-advised and shown duff stuff. I think they'll become disillusioned, and that's when the hobby will stagnate.

#### Disservice

My apologies if some of these ramblings appear extreme, but we will do a disservice to the hobby by passing on factual ignorance. I would really like to think there is a positive way forward, but without a continuity of individual model making, and a procession of advisers (be they demonstrators, writers, or You Tubers) who ensure that what they show is both factually correct and demonstrates best practices, we'll be in mortal danger of going backwards.

To conclude with some positive comments, here are a few tips I'd recommend you to follow to ensure optimum accuracy and authenticity in your modelling.


- Firstly always study the prototype the amount of historical information available in books and on line has never been greater.
- Choose to model an actual prototype as all the difficult decisions have already been made. If you must choose a fictitious subject then

please, please model prototype practices through careful observation and research.

 Treat any advice offered by self-proclaimed 'experts' with a degree of suspicion and check and verify it for yourself.

Being authentic and faithful to the prototype in our modelling, and ensuring that we are accurate at all times, is the only straight and true way forward for the hobby in my view.

## Moorside

've always liked roadside tramways, with their relaxed style of operation and often unusual locos and rolling stock. I had been involved in a society project to build a model of a narrow gauge roadside tramway set in the Yorkshire Dales, but this had sadly been abandoned.


Then, around 10 years ago, I had two periods of convalescence while I ran-in a couple of replacement hip joints. It seemed a good time to start something new and I decided to resurrect the roadside tramway.

I needed something small and light enough to hold under one arm while using a stick with the other. This enabled me to carry the model into the well-lit kitchen to work on it and to pack everything away afterwards. The previous project was called the Yoredale Tramway and I kept the original name.


#### Construction of the first version






Fig. 1 Moorside Station as first built Overall size: 950mm x 265mm. Each grid square: 100mm x 100mm.

The layout started out measuring 95cm by 26.5cm, using 3mm MDF sheet on a light wood frame, topped with 3mm cork tiles (see Fig. 1). On this I used Peco 'crazy track' to lay out a station based on that useful concept *Inglenook Sidings*. Mine was reversed, so that two of the sidings represented the main line with a siding, or


A Bagnall 0-4-0T engaged in some shunting. The loco was built by Paul Windle.

possibly the run-round loop. On small layouts like this space is at a premium and parts of the model may have to have more than one function.

The line ended in a paved area on the edge of town, now called Moorside, and in true tramway fashion no platform was provided. Goods traffic had a siding serving a substantial unloading ramp, suggested by those at Wantage Town on the Wantage Tramway. The siding continued into the Dale Head Farm Supplies. A kick-back siding into the coal merchant's yard was added to torment visiting operators.

With the limited width available the buildings along the back of the model were all low relief. The two cottages on the left were Townstreet Models castings, but the Yoredale Dairy (The Cream of the Dales) and

the field barn were made from Slater's moulded sheets on 5mm foamboard. The drystone walling, so typical of the area I wished to represent, is the excellent Hornby Skaledale product. But the stile was scratchbuilt based on those seen in Wharfedale, a part of Yorkshire I know well.

Wills provided the goods shed and coal yard office, the tramway office is a modified Dornaplas product, but the agricultural supplies shed is constructed from Wills corrugated sheet.

#### Locomotives and rolling stock

By the time I started *Moorside* I already had a collection of tramway stock. It had started with one of Paul Windle's Clogher-style locos and I had suitable tramway coaches and goods stock from my other layouts. Then, at an exhibition, I saw three of Paul's tram locos for sale. I could not work out which one to buy, so I purchased the lot! So the Yoredale Tramway now had the River Class




Fig. 2 Moorside Station now

of four Sharp Stewarts: Swale, Wharfe, Nidd and Aire, all named after Yorkshire rivers.

Coal merchants

Tramway offices

The mainstay of the tramway is crushed limestone from a nearby quarry, so a powerful machine for this traffic was produced by taking a couple of Peco Glyn Valley kits and combining them into a

double ended *bi-cabine* called *Yoredale*. This was a style popular in France, but Hunslet also made one for the 3' gauge Tralee & Dingle in Ireland.

A fifth, larger member of the River Class, *Ribble*, was supplied thanks to a 3D printed body from CWRailways.

#### The Mk.II Moorside

Moorside was now starting to be invited to exhibitions and this exposed a weakness in the original concept. Operation of the layout relied on considerable sleight of hand in what passed for hidden sidings. This was time-consuming and required much handling of stock, so there was nothing for it but to make a proper fiddle yard.

I've made a number of these over the years, mostly of the sector table type. This is particularly suitable for tramways with single-ended locos, as Board of Trade regulations required such engines to run cab first, to give good visibility when running in, or alongside, a road. As well as turning entire trains, which can be a life saver at busy exhibitions, locos can also be turned off scene, reducing stock handling.

The first sector table was 30cm in diameter, surplus from another layout. This transformed operation, giving trains somewhere to go to and arrive from. The table also acted as a throat point, allowing hands-off running round. It worked so well that I made a larger one of 40cm diameter with four tracks instead of three and Fig. 2 shows the current layout.

For exhibitions *Moorside* shares a display and lighting frame with another of my layouts, which was longer. It seemed a pity to waste this opportunity, so an additional 10cm has been added to the left-hand end.


This gave room for another low relief building and I also decided that the model needed proper backscenes. These were removable, to make access to the layout easier. The right-angled bends in the sky were disguised by a brewery and its chimney on the left and a half relief mineral transhipment shed on the right.

I could now run trains of two bogie coaches, or four four-wheeled wagons and a brakevan. The goods trains were shorter than the prototype would have used, but you have to make some compromises with small layouts.

#### Operation

At exhibitions the layout runs to a sequence timetable covering a full day, taking about an hour. There is a fairly frequent passenger service to connect with the main line. Twice a day a train of empty mineral wagons comes up to load with crushed limestone at the quarry transhipment shed. A daily goods service brings up staples like coal, food and agricultural supplies. Wagons can be moved into the shed and loaded or unloaded there.

With the fitting of backscenes on three sides the original wire-in-tube point operation became impractical. Also, although I prefer to operate from behind at exhibitions, at home I want to run the layout from the front. By powering the points it was possible to have a small control box on a long cable that could be used on either side.

There is not much depth under the layout and the Hankscraft slow-motion motors I have used before would not fit, so I experimented with servo motors. The servos operated the points perfectly, but interference from moving trains caused them to change unexpectedly. I found this out just a week away from an exhibition appearance! But by chance I'd seen another make of slow-motion point motor advertised by a UK supplier and had ordered three on spec and they were small enough to fit under the layout. *Moorside* went to the exhibition and these Micro-Mark point motors have worked ever since.

#### Conclusion

Moorside has evolved steadily over the years and I'm now seeing if I can extend the sidings to add sheep traffic. Sheep farming is important in the Dales and in the 1920-35

period that the model is set in sheep would still have travelled by rail.

The layout has grown slightly from the original concept, but I can still carry the scenic section under one arm, although these days I don't require a walking stick!

akham is the county town of Rutland and lies on a north-south alignment on the route of the former Syston & Peterborough Railway, between Melton Mowbray and Stamford. Four miles south of Oakham is Manton Junction where a line diverges for Corby and Kettering Junction, to join the Midland main line to London.


I surveyed the station in the summer of 2018 and these accompanying notes reflect the site as it appeared at that time.

#### Track and structures

The track layout comprises double track running lines, each with a goods loop north of the station; the up line being towards Peterborough. Interestingly, the up line has concrete sleepers but the down line retains wooden ones. Access to the down loop is followed by a trailing point which forms a siding into the Network Rail depot adjacent to the station. This siding is used mainly as a means of transferring road/rail vehicles onto/off track

but is also used as a repository for defective wagons and locos. The up loop finishes short of the goods shed, adjacent to the cattle dock platform, and is frequently used to hold a freight train awaiting its path. Additionally, both loops are used for steam engines on special train duties to take on water from a road tanker.

Signalling is a mixture of old and new. Exit from the up loop is protected by a trap point and is controlled by an upper quadrant stop

signal, fitted with a sighting board, whilst the main line signals are colour light; the up signal being cantilevered over the down line, as can be seen in the pictures.

The station platforms are approximately 300' long, but staggered by 200' as shown on the plan, and linked by a functional steel footbridge. The up side has retained its original two-storey station building which dates from the mid 19th century. It is an attractive design, with a portico entrance on the road side, and a long canopy with decorative supporting pillars on the platform side. Adding to its attraction, but modelling complexity, the building is made up of various 'wings' giving the impression of being added-to over the years. By contrast, the down platform has only a small brick-built shelter comprising a waiting room and an open canopied section.

At the south end of the station is a level crossing with twin arm barriers controlled from the signal box which, of course, was the prototype for the original Airfix kit designed over 50 years ago.

A typical Midland lattice footbridge provides a facility for those pedestrians who can't wait until the barriers are lifted.

At the Melton end of the up platform is the former goods shed, now the Grainstore Brewery which has a corrugated extension built on the base of the cattle dock, and a free-standing canopy on the road side.

#### Services and motive power

Thanks to being part of the Felixstowe – Nuneaton trunk route, Oakham sees an intensity and variety of train services that makes it an ideal subject for modelling the current railway scene. A typical day's services for March 2018 is shown in the accompanying timetable.

The regular passenger service is the hourly Birmingham – Stansted Airport service which is operated by Cross Country Trains using two-or three-car Class 170 DMUs. However, East Midlands Trains operates two 'skeleton' services, in order to work units to and from Nottingham depot for servicing and to retain route knowledge. There is an early morning train to Norwich, formed of a Class 158 DMU, and a late-night Class 153, which comes from Spalding. For similar reasons, some London – Derby services are routed via Oakham, using four-car

services, the route is frequently used for diversions when the Midland main line is closed, bringing HSTs and full-length Meridians through the station. Similarly, disruption on the Nottingham – Grantham – Peterborough line can result in EMT's Liverpool – Norwich service travelling via Oakham. Steam traction is regularly seen, either on special passenger services or undertaking positioning moves,







the return empty wagons are worked across to St Pancras Churchyard sidings and travel north on the Midland main line to Syston Junction so that they can simply reverse into the exchange sidings at Ketton. There is also an 'as required' train of MEAs with coal for the works. Container traffic has increased following development of the line to accommodate 9'6" high containers, and several operate during the daytime. Network Rail engineering or inspection trains also make an appearance together with occasional passenger stock working from Bombardier's Derby works to the London and south-east operators including new Underground vehicles. In addition to all

these, there are numerous light engine movements which can bring unusal sightings such as a GBRF Class 66+92 combination *en route* from Willesden to Brush at Loughborough.

#### The model

Although Oakham could be modelled as a continuous-run layout (particularly in N gauge), it lends itself more to an end-to-end format, sandwiched between two fiddle yards. It would be best presented as if looking towards the main entrance of the station for two reasons. First the frontage with its portico is a very attractive feature, and secondly, the row of terraced houses along Barleythorpe Road, which runs behind the down platform, would make a natural

backscene. At the Stamford end, the scenic break could fall beyond the level crossing where the view of the line is obscured by dense foliage, whilst at the other end, a natural break is formed by the modern concrete overbridge carrying the A606 Oakham bypass over the line. In reality, this is quite a distance from the station but we modellers have never been slow to compress distances, and it would allow more of the goods loops to be modelled.

So that is Oakham. Plenty of variety and operational interest, although some would say "it's not a patch on the days when Beyer-Garratts worked the Wellingborough coal trains"!

# Fish traffic for Dentdale

As a child in Cleethorpes in the 1950s,

IAN NUTTALL had a ringside seat for the
extensive fleet of fishing vessels, and the trains
that served them for onward transportation.
Thus for his LMS-period Settle & Carlisle OO
project a fish special was a must. This is how
he assembled the formation.

whilst Cleethorpes has been the butt of the occasional music hall joke, Grimsby cannot boast many claims to fame, but, in my youth, it was the largest and busiest fishing port in the whole world, and with justification.

Express fish trains departed daily, mainly down the old GN line via Louth to London, but also west and north. In my day they were entrusted to the capable Gresley K3 2-6-0s most frequently, although Thompson B1s also featured, whilst, in the 1960s, Britannia Pacifics 70035-41 were transferred to Immingham shed (40B). Their main role was hauling the fish trains, but I do recall being pulled by one all the way from Cleethorpes to Kings Cross in the heady days when Cleethorpes had direct trains to the capital, with a restaurant car to boot. These glory days finished on 14 October 1966 when the last fish train ran; no more would they create the characteristic, piercing squeal of loco flanges binding round the fully check railed curve by the dock entrance.

Nowadays the Grade 1 listed 200' high Dock Tower, an inspiration for the magnificent Campanile Torre Del Mangia by the Campo in Siena, Tuscany (or maybe it was the other way round...!) gazes down on a forlom, barren wasteland of former prosperity. Nearby the impressive Fishing Heritage Centre provides a tangible reminder of when Grimsby ruled the trawler world and, a mere half mile along the Humber bank, just inside the Cleethorpes boundary, the 'melodious' signature ditty of Grimsby Town supporters "We only sing when we're fishing" rings out from Blundell Park to show the mariner connection lives on.

I wished to replicate one of the Grimsby fish trains working hard over the Settle & Carlisle heading for the likes of Glasgow so, over more than a reasonable number of years, I have assembled around 30 examples of suitable vans, 20 of which are in a dedicated fish train going north, whilst the residue are on a through freight heading back empty to Grimsby.

#### The prototypes

In my 1937-47 era the LNER had assumed control of the extensive Great Central Railway Dock system which had put Grimsby firmly on the map. Hence my first reference point was the Peter Tatlow collection of books. His original authoritative publication *A Pictorial Record Of LNER Wagons*, published by OPC in 1976 was well received to the extent that he was encouraged to produce a fuller analysis which spurmed a further five volumes.

In the early post-Grouping years the LNER persevered

predominantly with outside framed designs, more in keeping with the pre-1923 vogue, although the company was forward thinking in one batch of 50 built at Doncaster in 1927 in that they featured a 14' wheelbase, which



This was my first effort to create a plausible, accurate and reasonably detailed LNER fish van using the 3H LNER 12T goods van as a reliable basis (which came free as Doug Hewson, proprietor of 3H and north Lincolnshire man used to deposit bags full of his failures from his injection mouldings on us at Grimsby & District MRS. It was easy to 'mix and match' to create a full kit of parts. I must have made a dozen wagons via this unusual approach; thanks Doug). I used plasticard to make new ends and sourced the necessary parts for a fitted underframe from ABS parts, whilst the chalk destination board was framed in 10thou x 15thou plasticard. With pin sharp vision - I did build this 40 years ago - I wrote the destination GRIMSBY (coals to Newcastle?) with a mapping pen and Pelikan Plaka ink. The legend FISH came from the Slater's 1.5mm alphabet; ideal. Weathering gives a work-stained, hard earned miles dimension and, despite its age, might just stand comparison with Bachmann's latest 'all singing, all dancing' release - or am I wearing my rose tinted spectacles? Those of you with a leaning towards the minutiae in photos will have spotted the Blu-tack chock against the right-hand wheel. Where I took my photos is on a gradient of 1 in 100; this wagon was so free wheeling it persisted in drifting off shot... I shouldn't moan.

was more suited to high speed running. By far the two largest Diagrams, Nos.23 and 134, generated 1350 and 1950 vans respectively; that's a lot of fish trains. The former were more old fashioned with their outside frames and 9' wheelbase, although they did exude considerable character and charm. The latter looked modern, boasting 12' wheelbases and inside framing; they became the archetypal latter-day LNER fish van.

Featured here is a third of my Grimsby – Glasgow fish train as it makes sure-footed progress up my 1 in 100 gradient northwards through Dentdale; as with the Pony Express, "The Fish must go through...". I have a venerable, though well weighted and powerful, K's Black Five for this service. The train weighs a ton; hence it is this or a scaled Hornby Dublo 8F... none of the present modern products are up to the challenge.





Parkside's LNER 12' wb fish van produces a basically accurate, well detailed kit. I have made the end door stops more prominent and added end lamp irons, whilst the weathered finish (dry brushing from a palette of Humbrol 26, 33, 34 and 113) and the 'Paisley' chalk name – which would suit the chosen destination of my train – impart that well used look. As much of the brake gear as is practical is attached from brass wire and, to round matters off, ABS castings provide the upright vac pipes and low hung steam heating pipes. My 229770 is from a batch of 800 built by Faverdale in 1938.

Studying Peter Tatlow's selection of Diagrams, wagon numbers and photographs I hit upon one anomaly. His comprehensive table of all LNER built fish vans (p145 of *LNER Wagons Vol.4A*) states that all 550 wagons built to Diagram 83 were 10' wb, yet, in his original book, plate 91 on p46 shows No.168975 from that group with wb 9' clear for all to see on the solebar. Perhaps just the first batch of 50, 168935-84, built at Darlington in 1932 were 9' wb, whilst the following 500 were uprated to 10' wb. I'm sure there is someone out there, more knowledgeable than me on matters LNER, who might advise.

Comparing this diagram with the standard LNER 12T goods van it is obvious that these are the roots of these 550 fish vans. The only obvious external difference is that the goods vans have horizontal end planking as opposed to the vertical ones on the fish vans.


In BR days the celebrated 'blue spot' fish vans were associated with the fish trains, as were the Bird's Eye containers, but they were all built post-1948, hence out of my period. However several of the LNER-built 12' wb fish vans were retro-fitted as insulated fish vans and turned out in white livery. Sadly I don't have the conversion dates, but I would suspect they were a precursor to the blue spot vans so would hazard a guess at c.1950, but don't quote me on it. Peter Tatlow lists four sighted examples, all I believe in BR days.

The LMS adopted a very different outlook to the LNER when it came to fish vans for the company included them in the non-passenger coaching stock listings; on a higher plane indeed, and I was keen for the LMS variations to be represented. The S&C is their home territory after all and I have presumed, but can't prove, that the LMS would provide vans for my service to some degree.

They may have been listed as coaching stock, but the first diagrams

of LMS Fish Vans built between 1923 and 1930 looked for all the world like basic goods wagons. The first batch, Diagram 1884, with fully slatted sides ran to, I believe, 53 examples, and were remarkably similar to the LMS beer vans, although they also had slatted ends. Next came D1885, the largest production run with 167 vehicles fitted with side and end vents. Photos are relatively rare. but evidence suggests that


Parkside's 6T LMS fish van to D2059; it is a far from ornately finished wagon, yet I like its proportions; a neat example of latish LMS output, governed somewhat by its WW2 build date of 1941. A crimson lake livery and coach style shaded lettering enhances its relatively plain lines. The transfers were from Powsides sheet M330. The XP and WB 10'-0" were from a waterslide transfer. I'm not a great fan of these and, despite my best efforts, the carrier film is visible. What does stand out, from this angle, is the fully fitted brake gear and shows that this example is vacuum fitted as opposed to through piped. It is not often that my efforts below solebar level can be seen clearly, but at least I know it is there.



This is a slatted sided LMS fish van to D1884 built, with much blood spilt, from a Jidenco kit. Notoriously they were not 'user friendly', yet did allow extra variety to one's stock. This is a through piped example turned out in LMS crimson lake livery with LMS coach insignia/lettering. I built this at least 30 years ago; the paucity of solebar detail is apparent, whilst the eagle-eyed among you will have spotted the buffers generic to all Jidenco kits and the non-matching three-hole disc wheels, probably all I could muster at the time, and haven't been sufficiently ruthless to address this shortcoming since... must try harder.




This is my own scratchbuilt version of LMS slatted fish van to D1884; its construction, using plasticard, was inestimably more user friendly than the Jidenco first generation etched kit. All bolt heads are individual 10thou cubes, a process which is remarkably straightforward given a modicum of practice and is an approach which allows you to place them exactly where you want, at no cost except time. When I built this, accurate and appropriate transfers were not available: even the PC (now HMRS) sheets didn't cover my requirements so it was 'mapping pen time again'. Over time – well over 30 years – my two end door stops have sheared off. Memo to self: "Next time remedy shortcomings before taking photographs..."





A similar van to that at the bottom of p133, but this example, 39488, carries the later livery with the word FISH moved from the door to the left-hand end. Here too is evidence of my efforts 'below decks'.




The first of my two Cambrian LMS fish van kits; the quality of the plastic injection mouldings is to be commended; the side and roof vents are particularly sharp. I opted for Lanarkshire Model Supplies cast buffers and a vacuum brake cylinder to denote a fully fitted example. I went to town with the lettering/lining, although I altered the number from the pre-1934 one displayed in Plate 154 of LMS Standard Coaching Stock Vol.1 to its later equivalent, which is more appropriate for my era. Mine is more work-stained than the official photo in the book. My yellow lining came from the HMRS LMS coach lining transfer sheet; I enjoyed the challenge. A tip for making the side vents seem 'see-through': before applying the body colour, paint the vent areas matt black, then dry brush the body colour here to leave the black in the grooves. It works a treat for little effort or expertise. Airbrush aficionados won't find this advice helpful; sorry.

the 50 vans from Lot 105 were built with two different plank widths, set alternately, whereas all the others were even planked; why I know not. All wagons to D1884 and D1885 were 9' wb, some were enhanced with fully lined LMS coach style livery. Many of the above wagons were only through piped; look for the absence of a vacuum cylinder. To me it is not obvious from the number series which were fully fitted and which were through piped; certainly none were unfitted. Some were branded FISH, although latterly this just became 'RF', often on the solebar, which I understand identified it as a fish van.

D1886 followed in 1931, the first venture into 10' wb variants. These only had end ventilators, although the basic body dimensions followed those of D1884 and D1885, that is 17'6" long and 7'8" body width. Underframes were given an upgrade on D1887 (1932) and D2059 (1945) as longer leaf springs, J-hangers and eight-shoe clasp brake gear appeared. Wheels remained standard diameter for freight stock at 3'1½" and, again, some were through piped, some fully fitted; take your pick.

A major, and final, advance came as the LMS drew to a close with the introduction of the six-wheel, 31' long express fish van. They still


had hand brakes and all appear to be through piped, not fully fitted. How many were built I can't say with certainty, although the number series starts at 40200 and I have seen 40265. Some were built to the same D2115 after nationalisation. Despite their late construction crimson livery was applied, enhanced by LMS coach style lettering.

Maintaining my customary soft spot for matters L&Y I was delighted to note that the company built 445 fish vans, to four different drawings between 1906 and 1919. With the L&Y feeding the S&C at both Skipton and Hellifield I felt duty bound to include them to a smallish degree.

It was a similar scenario with the Great Western Railway, if only to assuage those of Brunswick Green persuasion, or in the case of its fish vans, chocolate brown. The open wagon Tadpoles were, I felt, beyond my remit, but I was happy to consider a couple of Bloaters, as the company's fish vans were coded. Messrs. Atkins, Beard and Tourret don't lay out easy-to-follow tables of construction of the various Bloater Diagrams in their otherwise utterly thorough *GWR Goods Wagons* tome, but working my way through the section on fish vans I make it 270 Bloaters in total, nowhere near the output of the LNER and under half that of the LMS; yet another aspect where the GWR doesn't lead the way... oops, sorry lads, only kidding!



A blast from the past. I scratchbuilt this D1885 LMS fish van, from Lot 336, 40 years ago. I'm afraid the near-'ship anchor chains' three-link couplings are a bit of a giveaway... they were deemed most acceptable in those days when Hobson's Choice Ruled OK. Eagle-eyed readers will spot the dropped brake lever on the far side; since rectified... the camera can be too cruel at times. The channel solebar is 3mm x 1mm milled brass, which may explain the lack of fine detail, although I had entered the individual bolt head approach via 10thou plasticard 'cubes', so the body sits well and my efforts to replicate the see-through vents using 10thou x 20thou plasticard have, I believe, stood the test of time. I used my mapping pen and Humbrol paint to execute the lettering.



#### The models

In my dim and distant past I can recall buying some Hornby Dublo three-rail equipment from a fellow boarder at Barnard Castle School. Whilst *Duchess of Atholl* and its matching coaches in LMS livery took pride of place I do remember, amongst the goods vehicles, a tinplate van in post-1936 bauxite livery with the word 'FISH' just above the LMS. The Hornby Dublo blue spot fish van was freely available, but was too modern for me and, personally, it seemed a bit too wide; I hope I'm not doing it an injustice.

Nowadays I believe my standards are a tad more finescale and I enjoy taking the kit- or scratchbuilding route to achieve my desired selection of rolling stock. And where would we kit builders be without the likes of Parkside, Cambrian, Slater's, David Geen *et al*? Thank you chaps for your input and expertise.

I suggested earlier that in the first generation of LNER fish vans those to Diagram 83 were developed from the basic 12T goods van, and that is exactly what I did. The 3H kit was available when I started building LNER fish vans so I adapted a couple, adding fully fitted eight-shoe clasp brake gear, Ultrascale wheels, ABS brake pipes and Smith's three-link couplings. Some lead was glued inside, PC (now HMRS) Methfix transfers applied and weathering added as appropriate. Result! Unbelievably, despite over 40 years since building the first, my approach to kit construction has not deviated a great deal. Ultrascale wheels seem increasingly difficult to acquire, and more costly, so I tend to use Gibson ones now, whilst Brassmasters have recently given me an alternative to Smith's couplings; I am happy with either. These days I use replacement whitemetal buffers, or turned brass buffer heads and shanks, to prolong their working life; with three-link couplings buffers earn their keep.

It is only fair, and right, to record that Bachmann manufactured a well proportioned LNER 10T fish van to Diagram 83. Its example is from a batch of 100 built at Darlington in 1934; the detail on it is impressive, making kitbuilders raise their game to compete, which is no bad thing. I suspect the firm chose this very van as it is the one featured on p147 of *LNER Wagons Vol.4A*; I wonder just how many modellers who invested in one, or several, run them as 174894? Surely all modellers seek some variety and individuality?

From what I have written you will have gathered that you need to kit-, or scratchbuild to achieve a representative fish van train in the pre-nationalisation period. But this is fine as it allows us to acquire wagons with more of a personal touch and as much extra detail as we wish to include; happy modelling.



A raw comparison with the photo above – a scratchbuilt alternative to the Chivers Finelines kit which was a Christmas present from long standing model railway mate Roger Ellis. It is plasticard to the fore for the basic structure, whilst all strapping has individual 10thou cube bolt heads, and no expense was spared via screw couplings and PC sprung LMS coach buffers. Roger, you done well, my boy. I added the LMS lettering/numbering as, being addicted to the BR era, Roger has never seen such things. Now a good 30 years old; I believe it has stood the test of time well.



much enjoyed the experience. We were nervous about how the editing may portray the hobby, but in the end it seemed to be very positive – 77 Karl Stevens

t all began with a bit of self belief. Not just in myself, but collectively in the membership of the Aberdeen Model Railway Club. We have a great mixture of experience, enthusiasm and vision amongst our members, and I believed that would help us to produce something really extraordinary in a layout building competition.

After some initial discussions, those who were interested and could commit the time, formed the up and coming Aberdeen MRC Great Model Railway Challenge team.

The first question we considered was how the TV show might portray the hobby; it could be good, or bad, we didn't know. Whatever, 'let's just go for it' we decided. With the help of a friend we put together a short video showing each of us at home and in the club rooms. It was a very cheesy video, so thankfully no one else will see it, but we sent it off, and it wasn't long before we learned that we had been selected.

The theme we were given for our heat was Water World. We decided to tackle this as we would tackle a club or work project. So an initial planning meeting was set.

The TV company were at pains to point out that everything must be done in secret to avoid any 'spoilers' leaking out, so we all met on a non-club night.

From the rules we knew we had to build a 10' x 5' layout in just 24 hours, and were

allowed up to six pre-build items. We aimed for a twin track OO layout that would be built to the highest standard, would interpret the theme fully, and would be interesting and engaging for the public. Elements we wanted to show included; automation, DCC/TouchCab train control, animations, and the incorporation of real water on the layout.

The first evening was spent developing thoughts, ideas, and a wish list as to what we might achieve. These were marked on the clubroom whiteboard along with some pretty dodgy sketches, though we felt everything would be achievable.

After my 45 minute drive home from the clubroom, I found that Fin had already uploaded a fabulous 3-D render of the plan. How he had came up with this in such a short time after our meeting, still baffles me!

The plan was slowly refined over time. It proving invaluable, as we all now had the same vision on paper of what we wanted to achieve.

Our design was based on a north-east coast of Scotland harbour surrounded with a double track main line with a trestle bridge over a river estuary. To put an unusual twist on things, the layout was to be viewed from land, looking out to sea, as opposed to the more usual viewpoint of looking in at the shoreline from the sea.

This gave us ample opportunity to include some water features. We decided try several different techniques of modelling water; acrylic sheet (for the main harbour), two part 'pouring' resin (for a pond and culvert) and real water (representing a weir on the river estuary).

We also decided on various animations for the layout which included operating level crossing barriers, a wind turbine, a road system, moving boats in the harbour (using a special magnetic chain drive under the acrylic sheet), and because we had one, a working container terminal crane. We also wanted to include as many lights as we could to help really bring the layout to life.

The layout was to be operated via a computer so we could include block detection (using LDT RS8 modules) to enable the automatic triggering of the level crossing barriers as the train approached.


By now we were fully committed, we weren't going to fail, we would produce something to be proud of. Within the rules, we were allowed to pre-build track and ballasting on two of the three sections of our baseboard, and because we were going to do a harbour we laid a base of foam to raise the track base height above the baseboard top by about three inches.

Now the difficult part: whilst all this was going on, our great friend and long standing club member Dave Clucas passed away. We decided to dedicate the build to his memory: all layouts have a name and this one would be *Clucas Bay*. Perhaps this helped our build in a way. We were no longer just trying to win a TV challenge, we were trying to do our friend proud at the same time, and this made us double our efforts and commitment.

#### What could possibly go wrong?

We knew we would have to work as a perfectly coordinated team on filming days, so everyone was allocated a specific set of tasks. We realised early on that time would be against us, so traditional scratchbuilding was out of the question. Thus some of our budget was spent on buying pre-made Bachmann Scenecraft and Hornby Skaledale buildings. We would add extra detailing and lights to customise them to the theme of our layout.

We spent our time on the days leading up to our departure for the film location choosing what tools we would need. Where would that file or screwdriver be? And why wouldn't we need a chainsaw to make a model railway? Perhaps we ought to pack a sledgehammer, in

The weir was the only section of our water world which used real water. A small pump circulated the water from a plastic tank located beneath the baseboard. The water flowed across the rocks (and the old bike) and over the edge of the acrylic base of the weir, running back into the tank through the small gap.

case it all went horribly, horribly wrong!

With everything loaded into a van, and the rest of the team in an accompanying car, we set a *Top Gear* type challenge for the 10-hour drive from Aberdeen to the film set at Fawley Hill – the last group to the hotel would have to pay for the beers!

Next morning we arrived early at Fawley Hill, unloaded our gear and set about evaluating the competition.

#### On set

After our early start we were anxious but eager to crack on. We were introduced to the show presenters Tim Shaw and James Richardson, and judges Kathy Millatt and Steve Flint.

Tim announced, "On your marks, set, GO". We got cracking straight away knowing the priority was to get all the track down and tested. With the middle board still completely bare it was apparent that this was going to be both fun and hard work.

To raise the track above baseboard level we had used 70mm cavity wall insulation glued to the the baseboard top and carved away to form the harbour walls and estuary banks. A tip here is to seal the cut edges of the foam with white PVA glue to stop all the beads and bits coming off.

A light coating of plasterer's compound was used to create a hard the top surface. In an ideal world we would have left the glue, plaster and paint to dry before continuing, but we didn't have that luxury! We pressed on hoping that with the aid of hairdryers and

fan heaters it would all cure hard overnight.

Tracks were laid, wiring added, with all wires terminated with bootlace ferrules to stop any stray strands causing electrical problems. This was Mike's job: would he ever get out from under the layout? In the event we had a train running after just a few hours into the build. Honest!

The backscene we had for the layout was made from photos taken around the Scottish coastline with some enhancements from local towns, and printed out on large sheets. The key question was, how to attach this to the back boards? The initial attempt caused mayhem with the type of paper; there were bubbles and kinks all over so we changed adhesive, using four big sticks of a roll-on glue. This worked a treat.

As the building progressed I kept getting called away for an interview to camera. This was fine, except the noise from Heathrow's aircraft and the screeches of the local pet peacocks kept holding up the proceedings!

Kathy and Steve were always around and looking at what we were doing. Kathy, being an expert on scenery, was always able to spot any potential errors.

By day two our emotions were a mix of excitement and nervousness. Fortunately because of our careful pre-planning, we knew what each other had to do and we continued to progress well. One of the last items to get added on the second day was the small pond incorporating the two part resin. We had never used this product before, so with cameras rolling, myself and Fin mixed the solutions and started to pour. The mixture gets warm as the chemicals react, though warm is an understatement. The closer we got to pouring the hotter the resin mixture got. Will it melt the foam sub-base? we thought. Jeopardy!

In the event the pond filled to the brim and started to run down to the culvert. Er, stop filling the culvert now please: stop! Fortunately it did, and was perfect. Finishing touches would be done next morning.

On the final day we still had a list of things to do as long as one's arm. Once in the

> workshop we knuckled down and got things done. Iain got going on the electrostatic grass, I started on the oil yard, Fin on the town area, Ewan and Colin on fencing. Mike came out from under the layout and tried to finish my chain drive.

> With the clock ticking down, rolling stock appeared, the container crane was positioned, rock climbers were spotted on the cliff face and the mountain rescue team was deployed.

When "Time's Up," was declared we all stood back. We could now take in our incredible achievement in its entirety. Win or

lose, we knew we'd done ourselves, and most importantly Dave Clucas, proud.

Almost everything was finished, though the chain drive was short of a nut! Consequently there was a little lady on a lilo in our harbour waiting to be rescued. If we'd had another 20 minutes, we'd have got it working by nicking a nut from the hire van!

#### And the winner is...

After the demonstration phases and the final assessment of the judges, we stood in line waiting for the answer.

Shock and pride. We all looked at each other in disbelief as our club team was announced as the winner. We had done it!


# Normanton & Pontefract RMS' 50th

riginally known as
Normanton Railway
Modellers' Society, the
club was set up in 1965
when a group of railwaymen
started meeting in a room
above the Miners' Arms,
Altofts, in Yorkshire. As the
Society grew, the club
premises moved to
Normanton railway station,
then to East Ardwick and
eventually Methley, between
Leeds and Castleford, our
present home.

Our first exhibition was organised in the late 1960s by one of the founding

members, Alan Creswell, with a modest budget of £10. This was held at Normanton baths, which wasn't ideal due to the bouncy floor – not much good for the smooth running of layouts! The show was moved to Pontefract Town Hall for three years (with a subsequent renaming of the Society), followed by a return to Normanton in 1978 at the Community Centre. In 1999, the show relocated to its current venue of New College, Pontefract, where we will host our 50th exhibition on the last weekend of January 2019.

Several Society layouts have toured the exhibition circuit over the years. These include N gauge *Great Burden*, which was 15 years in the making; *Ramsfield* (00); and *Hardwick*, the club's first foray into 0 gauge. All these have previously featured in RAILWAY MODELLER, as have many of the Society members' own layouts. We have several new projects under construction, including one aimed at new members, which allows people to develop their skills before working on more advanced models.

The Society draws its membership from across the Five Towns district of West Yorkshire and beyond. Some members have been with the society for several decades

Over the past few years the club has visited several well-known personalities' own layouts, including the chance to try operating some of our members' own stock on them.



# Weatherbury Magna-part 2

**TONY CONLAY** is our guide around this O gauge layout, constructed by members of the Cornwall O Gauge Group and representing a Great Western branch station in Dorset which incorporates an offshoot of the London & South Western for good measure. Part 1 appeared in the January 2019 issue.



ost of the techniques that we have used are not unique to us and are well documented in most railway construction publications, so we will just focus on a few areas that maybe of more interest.

The trackwork was constructed from C&L components and as Weatherbury Magna station is owned by the GWR, it follows that company's practice in terms of sleeper spacing, rail lengths, turnout geometry etc. In order to create the flowing alignment we have used long, thin, flexible timber strips and dressmaking pins to plot the curving track and crossings. These were then drawn onto the baseboards and altered until they pleased the eye. Additional details were added from references on standards for GWR permanent way construction. The new curve

alignments used printed templates derived from Templot that were stuck down to the trackbed prior to the commencement of track construction.

The importance of detailing was mentioned earlier and we decided at an early stage that we would model the point rodding and facing point locks. Using a number of books and other publications for reference, 0.4mm piano wire was used for the rodding, whilst etched cranks, and rodding stools made up from Plastruct T section and Evergreen plastic rod meant we achieved, we believe, a convincing and cost-effective representation. The facing point locks were built using bits from the scrapbox.

One of the challenges faced when presenting a portable layout is the issue of board joints. Careful preparation of the trackbed and scenery can minimise the intrusion of the joints but we have also included, where possible, different techniques to break the line of the joint. The station platforms and buildings are not permanently fixed so that the board joint is hidden underneath, and a barrow crossing sits alongside a board joint so that the change in surface disguises the gap.

The station buildings at Weatherbury Magna were modelled on Culham and were kitbuilt with added details. The goods shed was modelled on the one at Tetbury, and the GWR signal box was closely based on that at Perranwell; both were scratchbuilt, as was the cattle dock. The kitbuilt LSWR signal box is of a generic design with added detail.


The stone retaining walls were mainly

constructed using Slater's dressed stone sheets. The stonework was finished in a method similar to that developed by the late Allan Downes, in that we





Careful planning was undertaken to ensure that the inevitable board joins would be disguised as much as possible. Here a barrow crossing marks out the end of one board, the gaps in the track being just visible in this overhead view.

The dedication involved in making the rodding runs, cranks and suchlike paid off handsomely in the end.

The 517 Class 0-4-2Ts underwent many changes in their long lives. No.1160 departs

alongside a Terrier 0-6-0T.

signals. Bracket signals were scratchbuilt using parts from a number of sources.

#### Control

The layout is run using a centrally-based control panel. Operators have coloured indicators at the entry of the fiddle yards to show the availability of an empty road. There is a clever switching system that allows an operator to move a train from the LSWR main line to the GWR main line and *vice versa* without changing controller.


As phase two approaches completion we will consider the move to DCC to drive the trains to the indications of the signals.


#### Conclusion

It has and continues to be an interesting and challenging project and we have all learnt a great deal about modelling techniques and it has taken us all to a higher skill level. The challenge is to maintain that level for phase two which is well underway with the carpentry and basic scenic work completed and track laid on one curve.

## **Milton Quays**

Ilton Quays is an end to end layout in EM gauge. It represents a main line terminus in Southern Region territory somewhere on the south Dorset coast west of Bournemouth in the early 1950s. It includes a quayside along a tidal river estuary providing goods traffic in and out and a passenger ferry link with the Channel Islands. All goods traffic moves by trip freight to an offstage goods yard and a small engine shed services the dockside loco fleet.

Being based in Southern Railway (Western Division) territory, the station building is derived from Southampton terminus; the turntable is from Ilfracombe; the engine shed from Dorchester South; the coaling stage from Plymouth Friary; the water tower from Axminster and the sand drying area from Barnstaple. On the non-railway scenic side we took the Custom House from Poole and some warehouse frontages from Weymouth.

Baseboards are open frame type using the Barry Norman box girder design with separate A frames, legs with an adjustable foot.

Visible trackwork is C&L flexible track with plastic sleepers for plain track with hand-built points, again from the C&L range, on a cork underlay. We have used 1:8 points on the main lines and 1:5 points on the quayside and in the loco yard.

The layout is operated on the analogue 12V dc principle with cab control with Lemaco and Fulgurex slow action motors; a form of route indication is provided by red LEDs set into the mimic diagram on each control panel. These are fed from contacts on the point motors so indicate the position of the points as well as the route.

Alex Jackson couplings are used between locomotives and trains because they are inconspicuous and, when properly adjusted, work well. Goods stock is generally fitted with them with uncoupling achieved by strategically positioned electromagnets.

Locomotive and rolling stock models in use are a combination of ready-to-run and kits, all regauged for EM use. All locomotives have a crew and, as far as possible, the relevant headcode.

The cranes for quayside are all scratchbuilt to scale from plans supplied by Bristol City Docks largely using Plastruct. They depict dockside cranes in use in the 1940s, 50s and 60s.

Thanks go to the group members, past and present, who have put so much time and effort into building and operating Milton Quays.



Through The Railway Room Door...

**Hook Norton** 

Having amassed a sizeable collection of Tri-ang TT from the 1960s onwards, **SIMON HOLTBY** decided to construct a layout to showcase the models as a diversion from his N gauge modelling. Living in Western Australia, a visit to the Warley show in 2001 provided a rare chance to top up the collection with more second-hand items. The layout's name was picked at random from a map of the UK.

or those of you who may have read one of my previous articles on my N gauge North West Highland Railway (RM August 2016) you may have noticed the reference to my building of a TT layout in the extra space made available following the move to a larger railway room in the house. This is the story of that layout.

#### Why TT?


This wasn't a sudden decision to try out TT – far from it! Back in the 1960s I had amassed a large collection of TT items and was struggling with some early layouts, in very restricted spaces. With the benefit of hindsight I then made the mistake of selling most of my collection (just retaining some scratchbuilt items)

to change to N gauge; which I still model today.


However, I was in the UK in late 2001 and was able to attend the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition. I noticed quite a few items of second-hand TT equipment for sale and felt drawn to purchase quite a few items. I subsequently purchased other models when they became available so had a reasonable collection when the extra space presented itself.

#### Why Hook Norton?

My default mixed collection of stock covers most regions of BR, so it was going to be difficult to justify a plausible real location for the project. I decided, therefore, just to build the

layout as a showcase to run my stock. However, I still needed a name for the station, so I decided on a pin-in-the-map approach and loaded a Google map of the UK. I then zoomed in progressively and ended up at a place called Hook Norton! I had never heard of the town before but the name sounded very pleasant.

While the layout isn't meant to be located at the real Hook Norton, some street views of the town showed it to be very attractive so some screenshots were printed off to use as a backscene.

#### Approach

The approach taken with Hook Norton was very different to that employed on my North West Highland layout. In the latter's case

there was a defined location and back history but for *Hook Norton* it was an undefined place with no attempt at any historical justification. It was really about providing a showcase for the mixed-bag of stock – about impressionism!

#### Layout

In all my previous layouts I had always drawn out the track layouts full size to optimise the features. However, with Hook Norton I had a rough idea about what I wanted but, because it was so loosely defined, I ended up really making up the layout as I went along. Having previously designed real permanent way for British Rail this gung-ho approach didn't come easily.

The final layout is unremarkable and simply represents a single line branch terminus with basic passenger, freight and loco facilities. It is assumed there is an industry just down the line which warrants

locos on incoming freights to travel down to the Hook Norton shed for servicing and stabling; hence justifying a number of light engine movements.

#### Layout technical details

#### **Baseboard**

This is basically a softwood frame of  $2" \times 1"$  and  $3" \times 1"$  timber with an MDF top; the first time I have used this, rather than insulation board. As there were no changes in track level or underbridges planned, the design and construction was pretty straightforward. The only minor complexity was the need to make it fit snugly and securely on a pre-existing sideboard.

The scenic part of the layout is on a single board, with a separate smaller one for the fiddle yard. The latter is only 1' wide as it sits partly below another board housing a small Japanese outline N gauge layout.

#### Track

Back in the 1970s I had hand-made a whole range of customised pointwork for the previously mentioned planned layout. Only two items were found suitable for *Hook Norton*, a single point and a three-way; both used in the goods yard. For expediency I used the Peco 12mm gauge points elsewhere. While the sleeper spacing isn't totally accurate for TT, they still look the part. I was surprised to find that Tri-ang flanges would run through the crossings, but it was necessary to remove and replace the associated check rails (this process being under way at the time the accompanying photographs were taken).

All the plain line was handmade using rail soldered to copperclad sleeper strip. To ease the tedium in producing this I only soldered every fifth sleeper, using card sleepers in between. While this looked OK, I experienced my first-ever temperature-induced rail buckle due to lack of lateral resistance – soldering all sleepers would have eliminated this problem. I thought that as the room was air-conditioned there shouldn't have been any problems – but the Western Australian summer heat found a way!

#### Control

As with my North West Highland Railway layout, this is simple analogue.

#### Buildings

With one exception, these are all hand-made and were all constructed back in the 1970s for the original layout. They represent a mixed-bag of prototypes, all made from plans produced in the RAILWAY MODELLER during the 1960s and 1970s. As they had been stored in a trunk for over 30 years they needed a bit of 'refreshing', but are otherwise unaltered.

#### Rolling stock

This is an eclectic mix of Tri-ang, Kitmaster and scratchbuilt items. The latter are survivors from my original collection and are therefore all of 1970s vintage. The Tri-ang and Kitmaster models are, of necessity, picked up on an opportunistic basis – the annual model railway exhibition here in Perth, Western Australia, sometimes produces some gems but at other times produces absolutely nothing! Being opportunistic, I don't get to pick and choose what to buy – that's why I have six Jinties and no Britannia!

I was particularly pleased one year to pick up the Tri-ang two-car DMU in good condition.

#### Conclusion

So, *Hook Norton* was built as a showcase for my accumulated collection of stock, a function I believe it serves quite well. However, seeing it alongside my other two N

#### "Not my scale..."



## **Dudley Town**

**STEPHEN SKELTON** advises that you should be clear about what you want from your layout at the outset.



have always been a compulsive collector and I have set the year that my layout represents as 1930 as a way of putting a limit on the locos I can buy; LMS up to Fowler and before Stanier is the rule. The difficulty with the project was that my knowledge of things LMS was gleaned from books and videos so what I have produced can only be what I think the real thing might look like.

After a lifetime of modelling, I have learned that it is important to be clear about what you want from a layout before you start. In my case, I want to be able to have several locos on the scene and have a busy sequence of shunting movements going on. One plan from The Railway Modeller Book of 60 Plans for Small Locations by C J Freezer had always attracted me – Minories – a suburban terminus lined by brick walls and arches. I decided to go for an enlarged version of that set in the Birmingham district.

The problem with a terminus is that it is difficult to find space for enough sidings to justify a heavy flow of freight traffic. A way The station throat with a Midland-outline signal box, built from a Ratio kit, and engine shed.






Beyond the road bridge lies the terminus and surrounding townscape, much of it built from Metcalfe Models kits.

of getting round this occurred to me when we visited York recently. The former Rowntrees goods only branch is now a cycleway with clear traces of former sidings alongside warehouses and factories. Traffic ran to and from these sidings from nearby main line yards. So using that idea, heavy freights arrive along my main line where a tank engine takes the wagons off along the 'freight only' branch and distributes them to industrial sites. The heavy freight loco goes to the turntable and servicing yard to await a return load. The shunting permutations are endless and I can have plenty of locos on display.

It's surprisingly difficult to find time to spend in the loft even in retirement. It's no good starting any modelling



project with less than two hours available. One of the old RM regulars – Peter Denny, who built Buckingham – said he liked to go in his railway room, switch on and run trains for half an hour. That is the joy of railway modelling for me; relaxing escapism. Although I have a timetable, I don't run a clock, so a typical half hour may only see one arrival or departure as I shunt the sidings, the branch and the loco yard.

Positioning the yard in front of the main running line makes shunting easier. An ex-Midland 1F half-cab rolls in with a short freight.

#### HOW MY LAYOUT DEVELOPED

Dudley Town is six years old: it started as an L shape and I have added a new section each winter when the weather keeps me off the golf course. My method is to get a scenic covering on everything as quickly as possible so that I can run trains. I then revisit one area at a time and do a more careful and detailed job.

The buildings include Metcalfe and Superquick card kits but I am really sold on the Scalescenes downloadable range. I have used a huge amount of retaining walls and arches which are a couple of inexpensive downloads printed over and over again, representing a great cost saving. Similarly , I have put in six bridges, all with slight modifications, for the price of one download. The Scalescenes buildings look really good and once you get the principles correct, you can do all sorts of modifications and variations. Brilliant.

I am now at the stage where the layout has expanded to fill the space available so I am busy upgrading section by section. No layout is ever 'finished' but I keep fiddling with the track plan. The pointwork in front of the signal box, for instance, is in its third incarnation. The station is sited in a cutting with the main building entrance on the High Street at first floor level, with steps and a goods lift down to platform level. There is an island platform with two faces, plus a parcels bay on one side and a carriage siding on the other. Alongside is the yard headshunt and then the engine yard and turntable. A plate girder bridge divides the station area from the goods yard and engine shed.

Of course, I learnt my modelling from the writings of C J Freezer, so the coal staithes are always the wrong way round! Beyond the yard, the main line and branch diverge as they pass under the aqueduct carrying a canal across the railway cutting. The main line climbs gradually to a point where it becomes double track, crosses a river then enters a cutting to go off scene through a tunnel. The



#### Layout technical details

#### **BASEBOARDS**

As this is a loft layout, an emphasis on lightweight construction is not a consideration, so I stuck to the old standard construction of chipboard braced with 2" x 1". I lifted the previous layout cleanly, so the L shaped base was reusable. I moved the backscene forward to reduce the width as I found it difficult to work on the area under the angle of the loft roof. The boards have remained flat and warp free.

#### CONTROL

The plans were made at a time when DCC was becoming more commonplace and instead of a fleet of 60 locos, I only had one to chip up, so I made the change to digital. Also, the new layout could be wired for DCC from the outset. Fortunately, my friend Julian Saunders had thoroughly researched the DCC options for his layout and I took his recommendation and went for the NCE Power Cab system which has proved to be very user friendly and reliable.

#### WIRING

Who said DCC needs less wiring? To give reliable running, a main cable (bus) is needed under the entire layout with droppers connected to each section of track. I made a serious mistake in relying on the point blades to make electrical contact and it's a constant battle to keep the blades clean. I should have wired in microswitches for each point.

I decided not to install point motors as I find the wire-in-tube method easy to install, cheaper and it dispenses with a huge amount of wiring. Once you pass 60, under-board wiring is seriously painful!

#### TRACKWORK

I have always used Peco code 100 track but I wanted to move to code 75 for its improved looks. However, I rescued 30 reusable points from the previous layout; using them represented a considerable cost saving so I stayed with code 100 with electrofrog points.

Railway modelling is supposed to be fun but ballasting and rust-painting the rails are such tedious jobs. In fact I am still working my way round the layout with the rust paint. Half an hour at a time is enough.

branch line climbs more sharply and passes various rail-served industries. First is the canal trans-shipment wharf, then a loop serving two factories, followed by the coal drops for the town gasworks. After the next over bridge, the branch continues into the fiddle yard to serve plenty of other assorted industries.

#### **ROLLING STOCK**

The daily timetable calls for 21 different locos and Bachmann has introduced a fine selection for the LMS in recent times. There are 1F and 3F tanks for shunting, L&Y radials and LNWR Coal Tanks for local passenger work, plus 4Fs, Horwich Moguls and Super Ds for heavy freight. They all get crew, coal and a degree of weathering but I don't feel the need to tinker further with them. I do think it is a pity that the L&Y radials don't have more electrical pickups. They can be moody unless the track is perfectly clean.

The coaching stock includes the Ratio suburban kits and some Triang/Hornby clerestories which help with the period look. It is surprisingly difficult to find road vehicles as all the manufacturers seem to concentrate on post WW2 up to modern day. I find the whitemetal kits tedious and fiddly.




▲ A Sentinel vertical-boiler loco is used for close work in the yard. A stable, as seen here, is a necessity for a pre-war layout.

#### CONCLUSION

My enthusiasm for the hobby outstrips my artistic capabilities but I hope that this article might inspire others to get started. Expensive locos and stock should be working on a layout, not confined to a display cabinet.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute to the contribution made to the hobby by Peco. The products of the Beer factory make railway modelling accessible to all. Long may it continue.



#### Starting all over again...

hen I first started reading the RAILWAY MODELLER in the 1960s, most of the featured layouts represented the pre-war Big Four because that was what the modellers of the time remembered. As years went by more early BR steam layouts appeared, then early diesel and electric. People mostly model what they fondly recall from the past.

I was no exception, having produced a succession of 1950s Western Region layouts. Layout building paused for a while until many years later, in 2011 Bachmann released its LMS 3F 0-6-0 locomotive, the old Tri-ang version of which was my first engine back in 1958. Consequently I had to have the Bachmann model and, as I looked at it on my test track, I decided to start over again. This time, as I mentioned earlier, I took the starting point from the *Minories* plan in this little book, which happily has been published by Peco continuously for many years

# Easy loads for modern wagons

**DAVID HARRISON** demonstrates the straightforward method he used for loading his N gauge rake of Freightliner MJA hoppers.



don't think I'm alone in that, after purchasing new items of rolling stock for my layout, I just want to place them on the track to see them run. Such were my thoughts after acquiring several sets of the Dapol Freightliner MJA twin bogie ballast wagons (see Reviews, RM October 2018). Straight away I observed that they ran well and had sufficient weight to remain stable on the track. However, despite being new and pristine in their appearance, I considered that my rake of hoppers would benefit from the addition of loads.

Making modifications of any kind to newly-purchased items of stock can sometimes fill me with a sense of trepidation, so I explored ways of adding loads to the wagons – and being able to remove them when required – without causing damage to the stock.

#### A novel use for Plasticine

After considering several options I chose to use plasticard for the load base onto which I would put a mixture of stone gravel to represent the load carried by these ballast wagons. In addition I would use Plasticine to provide height within the wagon and also as a means of securing the load to the inside of the wagon without using glue. To this end I visited a local stationer and purchased a packet of Plasticine – reasoning that if it was safe enough for children to play with, then it shouldn't damage the plastic of the wagons! First, I measured the internal dimensions

of the wagon body, transposing these onto styrene sheet. The rectangular bases were then cut out

using a sharp craft knife (taking care to keep fingers away from the cutting line). The styrene bases were then given a generous coat of grey enamel paint onto which a track ballast mixture was sprinkled whilst the paint was still wet. These were then left to dry overnight. The next day a further sprinkling



of ballast was added to introduce some contouring to the surface of the load, simulating the effect of overhead wagon loading. This layer of ballast was added using a 70-30 mix of dilute PVA and water; adding a few drops of washing-up liquid broke the surface tension of the solution, encouraging it to seep through the gravel. The loads were put to one side to dry overnight.

The Plasticine was supplied in flat strips of equal length – and in a variety of different colours; each strip was subdivided lengthways into six smaller strips. It was then an easy process of measuring and cutting the required sizes from the Plasticine to provide three small pieces for each wagon, positioning one at each end inside the wagon together with a central piece to support the middle part of the load. The Plasticine supports were set such that the surfaces of the loads were just below the upper edge of the wagon bodies. The loads, now dry, were added on top the Plasticine supports.

The result is a passable representation of wagon loads that can be removed at any time without causing damage to the wagons. The same method can be used to create removable loads for other open wagons, both modern and older steam-era designs.

#### Loading the hoppers



With the rectangles of styrene painted using grey enamel, and whilst the paint was still wet, granules were scattered on the surface. (The shade of the base depends on the colour of the load being used; black would be suitable for coal, brown for iron ore etc.)



A second layer of granules was added to build up the contouring that is evident on prototype wagon loads. This layer was fixed in place using a PVA/water solution, applied with a pipette.

Three pieces of Plasticine were pressed gently inside the wagon body, ensuring that the height across them was set equal. The choice of colour is largely academic because the Plasticine will be completely hidden when the loads are in place.

A pair of completed wagons with the loads in place. The load bases should be sized such that they drop easily into the wagon body, but with the minimum of gaps around the edges; if the fit of the loads is too tight, the loads may prove difficult to remove.

Adding buffer stops to your layout

**CRAIG TILEY** installs a pair of rail-built buffer stops using the latest plastic accessory kit to join the Peco OO bullhead range.

Buffer stops on the real railway are intended as a 'last resort' means of preventing items of rolling stock from travelling beyond the end of a physical section of track. Many different designs have been adopted over the years, with the most common types constructed of rail, with side frames bolted to the track and beams made from either wooden sleepers or rail sections. Despite the gradual introduction of modern designs in more recent years, countless examples of traditional rail-built buffer stops are still extant across the rail network.

Recently released by Peco as part of its range of OO gauge bullhead trackwork is a plastic kit that contains parts for two buffer stops (ref.SL-1140). The kit represents a common rail-built type of a similar design to that adopted by the LNER. Each stop comprises just three parts and assembly takes just a matter of minutes to complete.

The two sprues (one for each buffer stop) supplied in the kit. Note the alternative buffer beams for OO or EM gauges – the latter to complement the trackwork items recently commissioned from Peco by the EM Gauge Society (see News, RM December 2018).

#### **Building the buffer stops**

With the parts cut from the sprues, and all traces of the connecting pips removed with a file, the buffer stops are assembled with the joins secured using Plastic Weld. Note that the sideframes are handed; the 'double' feet



being positioned on the outsides of the running rails. Note that I have removed the lamp detail from the cross beam of one of the stops (intended for the end of a goods siding) – it being my understanding that lamps were usually only fitted to buffer stops at the ends of main running lines, such as bay platforms.



The buffer stops were painted a dark rust colour, mixed from quantities of Humbrol matt enamels Nos.33, 100 and 121. On the stop with the lamp I painted the cross beam a faded red colour by mixing quantities of Humbrol matt enamels Nos.60 and 121.

Once the enamels had dried I then added a dark wash using Lifecolor 'burnt rubber' acylic. This was brushed on before using a cotton bud to remove the majority of the paint. Once this weathering wash had dried, I then dry-brushed on some lighter rust shades, mixed to suit using enamels.





The feet of the buffer stops are designed to clip directly over code 75 bullhead rail section (inset). The fit is very secure, such that gluing the buffer stops to the rails (with spots of superglue) can be considered optional. The buffer stop pictured here has been positioned at the end of an overgrown goods siding (described in the July 2018 RM).

### Spreading the word

n just over a year on terrestrial television we've had The Biggest Little Railway in the World and The Great Model Railway Challenge, both generating comment and recommendations in daily papers and magazines. Whatever their unusual features or undoubted failings in the eyes of dedicated modellers, it was something of a breakthrough for model railways to be the subject of a brace of TV programmes, each comprising six hour-long episodes. Does this mean that our hobby is now considered a proper subject for documentaries on major mainstream channels?

So what's next? How can we capitalise on the opportunity that has arisen? To do so we need to spread our message far and wide, and strike while the iron is hot.

Why not submit articles about your club activities to local newspapers and radio

stations? In each piece present a single message as clearly as possible. Write simple sentences in short paragraphs - more daily tabloid than Sunday broadsheet. To arouse curiosity, start with a statement that at first reading seems implausible, or is revelatory, or controversial in some way. Cover the key aspects: who, what, where, when, how and why. Put the subject into context: origins, future plans and developments. What's novel about it? Is it part of something bigger? Include at least a couple of attributed quotes from participants, together with reactions from non-participants. Highlight any links to minority involvement, be that cross-cultural, multi-ethnic, or disablement. Include club

contact details: meeting times, website, phone number and e-mail. For security reasons, it may be advisable not to give the precise address of the

clubroom, especially if the club is the sole occupant.

Can three articles be generated by a single event?

- 1 This is what we're working towards.
- 2 This is what we've accomplished. 3 This is what happened as a result.
- Plan them as a whole, even though not all

and for close-ups of individual items. Why not include three or four shots that show the development of a model or section of the layout? For example, the boards with track, then with backscene and landform added, finally include buildings, vegetation, details and trains. It is good practice to provide captions that explain what each picture shows.

If you are invited to a press or radio interview, identify and select the key pieces of information you want to put over. Plan their order of presentation, prepare a flowing delivery, and practice speaking it out aloud. Keep what you say simple, succinct and slow. Refine it each time you rehearse.

> At least one national society is already planning pro-active engagement with the popular media to widen awareness of railway modelling as a worthwhile

and rewarding hobby. Others clubs can follow suit at local level.

And there's one thing you can do all on your own. You're holding it in your hand. When you've finished with your copy of RAILWAY MODELLER, donate it to the waiting area of your local doctor, dentist, optician, hairdresser, garage, or tyre depot. It could be far more interesting to their clients than a Cheshire Life from 2003, a booklet on dementia, or an ancient copy of the Daily Mirror. Why not stick details of the local model railway clubs inside it?

After the frenetic activity depicted in TBLRITW and TGMRC, what about some 'slow' TV? It could follow the creation of a new layout from scratch, and be self-filmed over an extended period, at a club room and perhaps at members' homes, covering sources of inspiration, research, planning and all those craft skills that go to make a fully-operational, scenic model railway.

Is this not an opportunity for one or more outgoing and innovative clubs with a proven track record of completing models to broaden public knowledge and appreciation of railway modelling in its true colours?

Spreading the word far and wide helps to promote the model railway hobby well beyond the normal boundaries defined by clubs, exhibitions and magazines. A big name will always help to get the mainstream media to take an interest, but there's plenty you can do yourselves. Your local radio station or newspaper will take an interest if there's a story with some human interest or jeopardy, but don't send in a layout description just yet!

### "I fail to understand 'purist' critics"

I had my first Tri-ang train set when I was six or seven; I sold most of the rolling stock when I was 16, and started buying again when I was 18, usually items from the local hardware store at Easter, the items which hadn't sold at Christmas. I have carried on all of my life, had a couple of layouts when the children were small – nothing decent. I have always scratchbuilt models of buildings or modified kits. Never had anywhere to do a 'proper' layout but followed the hobby.

I was pleased to see The Great Model Railway Challenge on the television at the time that I turned 65 and finally acquired a shed – well actually two as the first one was filled with tools and boxes, leaving no space for the layout!

The ideas, the ingenuity and downright cheating were excellent; it has gained our hobby modern status!

But I fail to understand 'purist' critics, "no research, no accuracy, no minute detail!" Not for me I'm afraid. I do not want a museum piece taking 20 years to build, followed by the lid being screwed on the wooden box; trains have never run so the 'beneficiaries' sell them because they were excluded ("Don't Touch!") and have no interest. But if it 'floats your boat' get on with it.

My wife has her own engine and rolling stock running from the quarry I'm building to the other end of the layout which is going to be a 'museum', because I have so many different items of rolling stock bought, literally, all round the world. So the Ghan rubs shoulders with Santa Fe, a San Francisco cable car, Burlington and a 1930s German guards van! I couldn't have one specific region, town, company or time.

But most of all I enjoy what I do and it provides fuel for my crazy mind which looks at things, turns them over and says "You know that could be turned into something else for my railway!"

Railway modelling attracts all types and ages: long may it do so and does not discourage any 'new' ideas. Let's be honest, a wider interest could bring down prices to the benefit of us all!

### Lead – is it time to ditch it?

Recently I received notification that the American Food and Administration (FDA) intends to ban the use of lead compounds in hair colouring products. What has this to do with railway modelling? Well, I know from past working experience that the FDA, which is an agency of the US government, is at the same time both conservative in its actions but also quite often ahead of the game. It has made the statement that there is no safe exposure level to lead, which opinion is based on medical research, and hence the forthcoming ban.

My own opinion from past researches is that many of us older modellers will be carrying a significant dose of lead in our bodies already and so anything which can reduce our exposure is welcome. I often wonder how many premature deaths in the modelling community are due to careless use of lead in the past. It is a cumulative poison and once in your body takes a lot of getting rid of, over a long period. The main sources of lead for railway modellers are whitemetal products and ordinary solder. As far as possible I no longer buy whitemetal products and only use lead-free solder, but so pervasive is its use in our hobby that it is often hard to avoid.

For example, I recently bought an O gauge Parkside kit and was surprised to find that the vacuum brake standard was a whitemetal casting. Thankfully it is supplied in a separate polythene packet, and it will remain so, unopened, as alternatives are now fairly readily

obtainable.

And so I come to the main point of my letter, that we as a community should voluntarily ban the use of lead in model railway products, and not wait for the forthcoming ban from the EU or UK governments, which will inevitably arise as soon as they get their heads around the fact that there are issues other than Brexit which require their attention.

There will be apologists who resist such a call they must realise the harm which lead does both to adult modellers but also and especially to the younger generation with their developing nervous systems. Whitemetal filings from modelling in the house cannot be effectively controlled and the minute quantities which find their way onto floors and carpets are a hazard to crawling youngsters who are oblivious to the risks. Smoke from solder can be seen drifting across the faces of youngsters taking up the hobby; let's hope it's lead-free.

It is time to ditch lead and use other alternatives which are kinder to the environment, our children and ourselves.

Some of its good points were its sturdiness, the excellent couplings, the remote control of electrically operated points and uncoupling rails.

The only derailments occurred when I ran trains too quickly around tight curves or crashed two trains carelessly by not spacing them properly over diamond crossings. When my son and daughter were young they wanted a layout. Starting with a basic Hornby train set, we gradually built up a reasonable layout.

When my children grew up, the railway boards were carefully stored until last year, when I decided to renovate the whole layout with new locomotives, track, wiring, point motors etc. However I have been disappointed with some aspects of the new products. The finer wheel standards seem far more prone to derailments.

Where is the fun when locomotives

constantly derail? Where is the fun when shunting becomes a nightmare? I admit it! There is a vast array of high quality ready-to-run material for the model railway enthusiast to buy. I know that standards of realism are a vast improvement over the standards applicable when I was young.

This seems to have come at a cost. I do wonder if the manufacturers have sacrificed fun and durability for exactness of reproduction.



The Great Southern & Western Railway's standard goods engine was the 101 Class, which under the 'grouped' Great Southern Railway of 1925 became J15, a classification which continued into the Irish State Railways, or CIE, after 1945. Designed by Alexander McDonnell, the GS&W CME, they were introduced between 1866 and 1903 and, much rebuilt, lasted into the early 1960s, frequently hauling and mixing with rolling stock many decades their junior. Two have been preserved.

00 Works' models are of all metal construction, as normal, and the J15 weighs 385g. It is driven by a coreless motor, and is most suited to conventional 12V dc. (Electronic track cleaners and feedback controllers are not recommended, and DCC decoders

must be hard-wired by the purchaser, there being no socket etc.) The motor drives on the trailing coupled axle via a worm gear. Pickup is arranged on the 'American' system, whereby the engine is live on one polarity, and the tender the other, all wheels collecting current. 00 Works provides care & maintenance instructions with the model.

The liveries available are grey as here, and black due to customer demand; waterslide transfers are included for the purchaser to apply, providing Nos. 109, 131, 162 and 196 along with the CIE 'flying snail' logo. (Our sample has transfers applied to one side of the model by OO Works for photo purposes.)

### 100T TEA tank wagon from Revolution Trains



Samples of the new 100T fuel tanker from Revolution Trains are now available, in Freightliner (pictured), VTG and EWS liveries. The real things date from the early 200s, and are used to carry petrol, avgas and other petrochemical products country-wide.

The models have been manufactured for Revolution by Rapido Trains of Canada, and it shows in the quality of finish and lettering, which is first class. The extensive catwalks atop the barrel are photoetched and are very fine indeed; the end ladders are moujlded in a springy engineering plastic. The aforesaid lettering is legible under magnification right down to the hazmat panel, and small brandings such as

EARTH HERE alongside the catwalks.

The wagon is quite weighty at 170g, so if you're thinking of running a 30-wagon rake as per prototype you'll need something beefy to hook on the front end! The tank is a smooth roller with metal wheels in the well-detailed bogies. Buffer beam detail parts are included for the purchaser to install;

the instructions advise trimming the additional parts if the factory-fitted slimline tension-lock couplers are to be used. (The couplers are clipped into NEM pockets, so alternatives can be used instead if desired.)

Revolution Trains' models are produced to pre-orders, but shops such as C&M Models in Carlisle, Trains 4U, Rails of Sheffield and Kernow Model Rail Centre may have stocks.

Hot on the heels of the Heljan O gauge GWR 61xx large Prairie - reviewed in our December 2018 issue - is the manufacturer's second steam outline release for 7mm scale, in the shape of the Churchward 43xx 2-6-0. Introduced in 1911, these machines could be found right across the GWR network; a combination of power and availability made them popular with engine crews, and they could be tasked with all manner of services. The last was taken out of traffic in 1963, and a couple have made it to preservation, one being of the later type with side-windowed cabs, introduced under Charles B Collett's tenure at Swindon.

Our sample wears the 1940s plain green with GWR tender lettering very well (although consultation with prototype photos suggests that the cabside number plates on the model should be without the orange lining). The real No.5320 was built in August 1917 and withdrawn in September 1948, so the model represents it in the last few years of its service.

The Heljan model covers Nos.4321 – 4399 and Nos.5300 – 5383, with the manufacturer producing versions in two distinct variants; GWR-liveried examples with inside steampipes, tall safety bonnet, spectacle plate windows and tapered buffers (as per our sample) and BR-liveried examples with outside steampipes, short safety bonnet, no spectacle plate windows, parallel buffers and smokebox door-mounted lamp bracket.

The large Prairie and Churchward mogul are closely-related prototypes, sharing, for example, the same cylinders, driving wheels and motion components. Heljan has exploited this commonality of parts to develop the two models in parallel. (It was revealed in our November 2016 issue that the manufacturer was developing the mogul).

The model squares up very well to published dimensions, and to our eyes has the look of a 43xx very well. Cab detail is excellent – no hiding with those spartan Churchward sides! – and small details such as the ATC conduit on the driver's side, the handbrake and water scoop handles, and the fire iron supports are formed in a springy engineering plastic. In contrast to the enclosed cab of the Prairie, the spartan mogul cab affords clear visibility of the firebox glow.

The chequerplate on the tender front and fallplate is very fine, although the moulded coal load in the tender doesn't convince – and is crying out for



being covered in a smattering of real coal. The supplied coal load does in fact appear to be moulded separate from the tender body, and therefore should be removable if the modeller is so inclined; furthermore, the photo of the disassembled view of the tender suggests that this would reveal an impression of the tender coal space beneath

Buffers and drawhooks are sprung, and handrails are made from wire. There is no hook on the fireman's side of the buffer beam on which to hang the front coupling, in GW style.

The model is supplied ready for 12V dc analogue use. Performance is very smooth and quiet straight from the box; the manufacturer recommends an hour's running-in light engine each way. Weight is a hefty 1.5kg (the locomotive accounting for 1.15kg), so the model should be able to match the kinds of tasks entrusted to the real things. In contrast to the transmission arrangement on the Prairie, the motor in the mogul is contained completely within the firebox; this to retain daylight beneath the full length of the boiler; a suggestion of the inside motion is provided between the centre pair of splashers.

In our review of the large Prairie we were critical of the disassembly required to access the DCC blanking plug (housed in the smokebox). However, it is pleasing to note that decoder installation is much more straightforward in the mogul; the blanking plug being



located in the tender, which is accessed by removing the tender body, itself retained with just two screws. The analogue PCB housed therein can be exchanged for an ESU Loksound L4.0 decoder (which needs to be obtained separately by the purchaser).

The mogul is equipped with the same sound chamber as the Prairie – engineered into the underside of the locomotive chassis – to accept a suitable speaker. (It should be noted that the locomotive and tender are permanently coupled, with a discreet wiring loom running between the two.)

This is sure to be another popular release from the Danish manufacturer, which serves to broaden further the fast-growing choice of GWR prototypes available ready-to-run in the 'senior' scale. Tim Rayner & Craig Tiley

### **More new liveries from Hornby**

Two more recent releases from Hornby will interest those who cover the current scene or the first few years after the formation of British Railways.

There is No.46225 Duchess of Gloucester, styled in similar vein to the LMS black example seen last month, but with the experimental BR blue livery in which many top-link power appeared in the early 1950s. The combination of blue and sloping-top smokebox ties the initially-streamlined Pacific down to the time between April 1950 (former applied) and January 1955 (changed to cylindrical).

Its specification matches that of the LMS black example seen last month.

The Class 67 (see Reviews, RM November 2012) is now available in the orange, yellow & black colours of freight operator Colas Rail as No.67 027 Charlotte, representing one of the pair which the company acquired from DB-Cargo – the other is No.67 023 Stella. The locomotives' top speed of 110mph makes them handy for use with Network Rail test trains.

The company name and nameplate are printed across the bodyside ribbing well; there are solid replacements for the latter within the packaging, to be affixed to the loco using Blu-tack. Two types of tension-lock couplings are in the detail parts bag, along with buffer beam details and full-depth air dams. These can be used to treat both or just one end of the loco if it is be be used in a fixed rake of stock.

Mechanically the model is identical to the new-tooling replacement for the Lima 67 which Hornby acquired in the



mid-noughties. A brief resumé from the time it made its appearance (Reviews, November 2012): the loco weighs 640g and has provision for DCC sound thanks to an 8-pin socket and space in the fuel tank for a speaker. Buffers are

sprung, and the model's standout features – the see-through grilles – are as impressive now as they were then. Day and night settings are configurable on 12V dc by a switch on the underside.

Editor Steve Flint hit the nail on the head with an analogy that summed up the famous firm's recent rough ride,

"The patient has left the psychiatrist and is well again." he opined.

Certainly Hornby has got its mojo back, which for the industry as a whole is no bad thing.

Before revealing the 2019 programme Simon reminded everyone that the industry we are in focuses on peoples' creativity.

"It's not a toy industry." he declared, "It is unique, covering all levels of creativity from opening a box to building a tree from wire and string."

When Simon walked back though the door in 2018, along with fellow directors Lyndon Davies and Tim Mulhall, the plan was to restore support for the retail trade, cease the unpopular online discounts, and return to the original headquarters site at Margate by March 2019.

Simon was emphatic that the present management is turning the tanker around away from rocks and out into open water again.

#### Train sets

As ever, Simon started his product notes with train sets, these being the fundamental first bite of the model railway bug for many. He had wanted better sets for a while so he was pleased to announce a Paddington Bear branded battery-powered set with plastic OO gauge track.

"Sets are fundamental for model railway enthusiasts – they always have been – it is where interest in the hobby is first germinated so this set has brand reach loved by children and adults alike."

The set will be available from June 2019.

### Analogue train sets

Four new sets were shown; Santa's Express An ideal Christmas present that will be used long after the festive season.

Industrial freight comprising an oval of track with siding on a Trackmat for play value. The GWR high speed train features ex-Lima HST tooling, again with an oval of track plus siding. Kids love high speed!

Eurostar set features the new livery on original style tooling.

These sets will be available from July 2019 onwards

### Digital train sets

One digital set The Mixed traffic set is to be released next year. A twin loco set depicting the variety of trains

found on a modern heritage railway. It includes the entry-level Select controller. Available November 2019.

#### Harry Potter theme

A new agreement with Warner Brothers means that Harry Potter features large. The Hogwarts Express set will be introduced in September with a Hall class loco model, an oval of track plus siding, and two Mk.I coaches. The Hogsmeade structures are made up from a selection of Skaledale ready-to-plant buildings, with new longer platform sections.

#### Railroad range

The Railroad range of budget priced models is increasingly significant. In the expanding range are more free-lance 0-4-0Ts and the Caledonian pug; the J83 in LNER green, and even the Dean single: despite its age this 4-2-2 is still good – and DCC ready.

Simon explained that the Crosti 9F was also now in the Railroad range In any case, he noted, modellers can always add detail if they want to.

Internal combustion models include the Bagnall diesel, Royal Train 47s, and original-livery HST power cars (formerly Lima tooling).

Railroad rolling stock includes Great Western clerestories, and Coronation Scot coaches in blue. There is also the ex Lima breakdown crane, which once again represents great play value.

#### Steam locomotives

As well as the new-tooling projects illustrated here and summarised in the adjacent panel, there was much to be excited about with reintroductions.

The incredibly successful Peckett W4 Class 0-4-0ST originally introduced in 2015 will reappear in new liveries.

The 'Lanky' pug will be in LMS black and early BR; the SECR H Class will be in early BR finish. There will be two new versions of the J36: No.62535 Gough in BR black and in ROD khaki.

A new Duchess of Montrose will wear early BR green, alongside a streamlined version as Princess Alexandra.

There will be three versions of perennial favourite Flying Scotsman; in 1920s A1 finish, BR blue, and with extra tender and fittings to mark 50 years since its trans-Atlantic barnstorming tour, beginning in 1969. Mallard will be released in express blue, and No.60028 Walter K Whigham in purple blue. The 01 2-8-0 will appear in LNER and early BR liveries Other releases include; Britannia Class Anzac, Merchant Navy Ellerman Lines (unrebuilt) and sister SR Pacific Aberdeen Commonwealth in wartime black with sunshine lettering.

### Electric locos

The well-regarded Class 87 will be named Stephenson and Royal Scot – both names carried by the same real loco – plus Royal Sovereign in Caledonian Sleeper finish, and 92s in DB Cargo Romania and Caledonian Sleeper liveries.

#### Diesel locomotives

A 'Co-Co Cavalcade' of diesels will appear in 2019, all re-introductions.



Notable will be Class 66 variants (former Lima with upgraded mechanisms) at an anticipated price of only £75.00, including EWS, DBS, Biffa, GBRf (UK flag motif), Freightliner, BR large logo, and Evening Star liveries. There will also be the class 60 in DBS livery with sound, and a 67 in Belmond Pullman colours to enable the top and tail formation, and Class 31s in BR green and blue finishes plus Network Rail yellow.

#### Train packs

These will include Eurostar driving power cars, the excursion train Northern Belle, stock for the Belmond British Pullman, and a Class 800 Azuma in LNER livery.

Multiple unit packs include Class 156 (ex-Lima) in Northern Rail finish, named Spirit of the Royal Air Force, a Southern 2-HIL mixture (half BIL, half HAL) and 2-BIL, along with LNER livery HST power cars.

#### Coach packs

These will comprise Eurostar centre coaches, extra Mk.lls for the Northern Belle, and – by popular demand – Hitachi test train centre coaches, which will be in a limited run.

#### Coaches

The long-bodied GWR clerestories will reappear, fully lined (these are the flat sided no raised panelling, in fully lined out livery). The LMS 12-wheel diner is back in BR carmine & cream. Other catering vehicles include; a Maunsell BR liveried item and New Century Bar Pullman. Also new are LMS 57' coaches, BR crimson LMS non-gangwayed

stock, Collett bow-end gangwayed coaches in GWR chocolate & cream.

Other new releases include a blue GUV, Network Rail dormitory coach and tool van BG, LNER Mk.IIs.

#### Wagons

SR cattle wagons appear in BR bauxite, and various-plank PO wagons will now have NEM couplings. We can also look forward to Railfreight HEAs, LNER CCTs and a BR CCT with graffiti.

Other releases include a new vent van with sound, timber wagons, 75T breakdown crane, triple mineral wagons, LNER toads in NE and BR, BR unfitted grey GW toad.

#### Power and control

There will be a revamped analogue controller, and updated Select DCC unit, which now features CV programming, 29 functions, and invokes complete track isolation when shorts occur. There will be a new Railmaster

select-a-link connector, which allows for an unlimited number of locos on the Railmaster database. Control is by iPhone, Android, even voice. New TTS decoders will include sounds for HST Valenta engines and a Black Five, and there is also to be a decoder to suit the six pin socket for small locos such as Pecketts.

#### Accessories

Behold – the return of the track rubber! Why the old management dropped, questioned Simon, is a mystery. The rolling road returns too. A lot of accessories were dropped by the previous management, evidence that they forgot that Hornby is a system product. Scenic materials return too, 72 new items including scatters, lichen, trees (hand made), glues, ballast etc. Skale autos also rejoin the range Ford Anglia, BMC Minis, tractors and traction engines etc.

#### Skaledale

Granite walling, tunnel portals, walls etc plus police call box, pill box, layout furniture and so on; all pocket money stuff. No brand new buildings. People and animals reappear in the catalogue, duplicated from old tooling.

#### In closing

Simon's closing remarks emphasised that Hornby is very serious about model railways; if one takes a look at a Hornby catalogue there's going to be something in there for everyone. Leaving the presentation with the audiance wanting more, Simon noted that 2020 is Hornby's centenary. "We're in", he declared. That's certainly the case.

### **WARLEY** NEC SHOW

## Highlights



Last month we presented an overview of the new product updates and project announcements made at the Warley show over the weekend of 24 & 25 November. Now it's time to round up the rest of the coverage.

There was no single centrepiece prototype display, but two locomotives from the Romney Hythe & Dymchurch Railway, plus the famous 15" gauge railway's Royal Saloon were on show, plus a West Midlands double-decker bus, and two exhibits from the Statfold Barn Collection.

Making a suitably sombre display to mark the centenary of the end of the First World War, a Hunslet 4-6-0T from the Apedale Railway marked out the selection of layouts with a WW1 theme. One of the latter, Q Dump, received the Mayor of Sandwell's Trophy for the layout the incumbent liked best: this year Councillor Joy Edis handed the award to Nigel Tansley of the Q Dump crew. (The Warley club is headquartered in the borough of Sandwell & Dudley, and invites its mayor every year to view the exhibition and present the award.)

Northern Chief from the RH&DR was one of two 15" gauge locomotives on display.



### Personalities and presentations

As usual, a number of trophies and awards were handed out over the weekend, including a couple of brand new ones. The RAILWAY MODELLER Award was presented to Love Lane, a ScaleSeven layout that was making its exhibition debut at the NEC. Editor Steve Flint presented the award to the operating crew.

Two awards were inaugurated in memory of Sir William McAlpine, who passed away in March 2018 (an obituary was published in our May issue). The new awards recognise modelling and railway societies, with the recipients being presented with glass-cased statuettes of Sir William to keep. (These were 3D-printed by Modelu, utilising a laser-scan that Sir William commissioned from Modelu at the 2017 Warley show.) The awards were presented by his widow, Lady Judy McAlpine, firstly to Richard Harper (for Sidmouth, the 2017 RM Cup Winner), and to Steve Johns and lan Mathews of the LNWR Society. These will be annual presentations.

As the president of the Association of Larger Scale Railway Modellers, Lady Judy also handed out the award for the best exhibit in a

scale of 7mm/ft or larger; the winner was Giles Favell for *Denton Brook*.

The other awards, presented by the Warley MRC and other organisations, were handed out by music producer (and Warley club member) Pete Waterman, as detailed in the captions on the opposite page.



### Exclusive versions of Accurascale 00 Deltic model announced



In our January issue we reported on the plans of Accurascale to produce what will be the firm's first locomotive model – the Class 55 'Deltic' in OO. Accurascale will be releasing 17 different versions of this all-new model, for which tooling was scheduled to be underway by the time this issue went on sale, with a late-2019 release targeted.

In addition to Accurascale's own programme of Deltic releases, there will also be a series of six exclusive models that are being marketed jointly by Locomotionmodels, Rails of Sheffield and the Deltic Preservation Society. Notably, this means that all 22

class members will be covered.

The six exclusive versions will comprise: 55 015 Tulyar in 1980s BR blue livery with white cab; D9019 Royal Highland Fusilier in post-1965 BR two-tone green; D9009 Alycidon in 'as preserved' BR blue livery with high-intensity headlight and GPS pods etc for main line running; and D9008 The Green Howards in 'as delivered' c. July 1961 ex-works green livery without yellow warning panels and without names. There will be two versions of D9002 Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry; one in two-tone green livery as currently preserved and running on the national network; the

### **Kernow parades painted D600 Warships in 00**

This second run will comprise the same four models as the original run, together with two additional versions: The first four will be certified limited editions of 150 pieces and will be supplied with numbered certificates of authenticity and an appropriate named train headboard; the Bournemouth Belle, Golden Arrow, Atlantic Coast Express or Royal Scot.

## Dapol delivers the goods with expanded UK production

Dapol announced in early 2017 that it planned to expand its UK production capabilities, which subsequently saw the delivery and commissioning of a new injection moulding machine at its Chirk facility in North Wales. This recent investment is now starting to bear fruit, with the first stocks of several O gauge 9' wheelbase wagons – all produced from newly-commissioned tooling – being delivered to stockists.

The models cover lime vans, salt vans, a five-plank open coal wagon and two types of seven-plank open coal wagon (side and end door, and side door only variants), examples of which are illustrated here.

### Progress with Bulleid light Pacifics in N

Dapol has also reaffirmed its plans to produce N gauge models of the Bulleid air-smoothed light Pacifics. Originally announced in RM November 2011, and following a period of time where the project was effectively placed in abeyance, the project has seen significant progress in recent months, with a revised specification outlined by the manufacturer: this includes a powerful new locomotive-mounted motor, diecast chassis and locomotive body, partial chassis compensation and a Next18 decoder socket.

### New releases from Train-Tech

Amongst the latest releases from Train-Tech is a working digital Smart Screen, which modellers can customise with their own messages to bring an extra level of operational interest to their layouts. Multiple screens can be displayed, which can be triggered by a range of different inputs including switches, DCC commands and even track sensors (which can be used to show a different screen as a train passes).

Although primarily intended as station platform displays, these smart screens could also be fitted inside modern-era passenger vehicles (such as multiple units) to display destinations and stopping points.

The small Smart Screen module (which measures  $31\text{mm} \times 9.5\text{mm} \times 4.5\text{mm}$ ) has everything built inside; installation requires just two wires from the module to be connected to either; an 8-16V smooth dc, or DCC, power supply.

The Smart Screen is supplied pre-loaded with a demo display, but modellers can fully customise the screen with their own messages using a DCC controller; however, once set up the screen can be powered using DCC or DC supplies. This is fully explained in the instructions provided.

The Smart Screen is priced at £50.00 (£90.00 for a twin pack), with station platform housing sets available for an additional £10.00 each.

Train-Tech has also released its SR1 Sound Track, which takes the form of a portable sound recorder (with built-in microphone and loudspeaker) that a modeller can use to record sounds at prototype locations and then set them

to replay automatically on their layout.

The recorder has four separate sound tracks, each of which can be replayed using control switches, or triggered by a track sensor; one suggested application for 12V dc control would be to record actual locomotive whistles/horns, which can then be played back as models pass over a particular section of track. Another use could be to create bespoke station announcements, which are played automatically as a train arrives at a station.

In portable mode the Sound Track (priced £69.00) runs off an internal 9V battery, but can be connected to DC or DCC power supplies when in use on a layout.

Train-Tech has also released its ST10 Track Sensor Plus (priced at £25.00 each), which is essentially an updated version of the firm's existing Track Sensor; installed next to the track the built-in infrared sensor can be

## Industrial 'print your own' boxfile layout in 4mm from Scalescenes



Scalescenes has developed a 'download and print' kit for an industrial micro layout that can be built into a boxfile. The online download (ref.LYO1, price £9.99) comprises two PDF files; one contains the files for the kit in the form of A4-sized (210mm x 297mm) full colour pages and the other PDF contains comprehensive illustrated step-by-step instructions. The PDF files for the kit can be printed from a home computer and mounted onto thicker card as specified in the instructions.

Once downloaded, kits can be printed multiple times. The structures on the layout have been designed such that the entire layout can be safely 'flat-packed' back into the boxfile.




Suggested track plans and boxfile cutting templates are also included. There is also a choice of colours for some parts, together with a ready to print backscene. Although intended primarily for OO, the kit can also be used as the basis of a OO9 model. (An N gauge boxfile layout kit is planned.)

### Guide to point rodding published
